### PITCHER & FLACCOMIO PICKS FOR JANUARY

### BEST EVENT: NEW YEARS CELEBRATIONS ACROSS FLORENCE AND TUSCANY

Get ready for a big one!! It will be a 'widespread' New Year's Eve with lots of music across four major piazzas. This year, there is a ban on personal fireworks and glass containers in the streets of the city centre for the love of our furry friends, which means the parties will be safe and stupendous! Here are the biggest events for the night, (thanks to <u>La Nazione</u>), being presented by the Comune for the whole city to enjoy:

**Piazza Santissima Annunziata** will come alive from 10 pm with a Gospel concert organised by the Musart cultural association. A show that will combine religiosity, music and beauty by two groups, The Pilgrims and The Women of God. There will be music in the square from 9.30 p.m, and the presentation and countdown is entrusted to Eva Edili, journalist and radio speaker.

In **Piazza San Lorenzo**, the Toscana Classica orchestra in collaboration with the Kharkiv Philharmonic Orchestra will offer a programme ranging from Strauss, Rossini, Bizet to Morricone. An evening of great music, starting at 10.15 p.m. until one o'clock, which does not forget the war in Ukraine. The collaboration with the Kharkiv orchestra is an important message of awareness.

In **Piazza Signoria**, Aria Network culturale in cooperation with Creazioni Associazione Culturale and FaRM has organised an event combining acrobatic performances, video-mapping, music and light games, tailored to the location of Palazzo Vecchio. The Compagnia eVenti Verticali, which works on an international level creating unique shows with a strong visual impact, integrating climbing and circus techniques, from 9.00 p.m. to 1.00 a.m. enjoy this site-specific performance that will transform the façade of Palazzo Vecchio into a real stage.

The Oltrarno parties from 21. 30 to 1 p.m. with a stop for midnight in Piazza del Carmine. The squares will be traversed by three Tuscan marching bands: Bandao, a percussion orchestra with a repertoire ranging from the sounds of Italian musical traditions to the characteristic sounds of countries such as Brazil, Cuba and the African continent, the Magicaboola Brass Band, a modern street band made up of wind instruments and rhythm instruments, and Pulsar, born as a student group and now one of the best known and most established street bands, an event organised by the Music Pool association.

### BEST TRADITION: LA BEFANA VISITS DURING THE EPIPHANY, January 6

On January 6, La Befana arrives in Florence and this is Italy's traditional day of gift giving. In the Christian tradition the name "Befana" is a popular version of the Greek term "Epiphany", commemorating the visit of the Magi. The legend says that the three wise men on their journey were stopped by an old woman with a broom who asked where they were going. They explained they were following a star that would lead them to a newborn baby, and invited her to come along. But she was too busy sweeping and cleaning and so she said no. When she realised her mistake, her regret was so great that she continues to wander Italy. During the night between the 5th and 6th January, (when the Wise men found the baby Jesus), she flies over the houses on her broomstick and enters each home

through the chimney (or in modern apartments, through the keyhole). Into the socks left hanging near the fireplace, she leaves candies and gifts for good children, and black coal (or black sugar today), garlic and onions for the naughty ones. Parents would always include some coal over the gifts, to trick their children! And the night before, the family leaves some wine and cakes for the old lady.

Piazza Peruzzi is a charming, queit 13th century square in the Santa Croce neighborhood, within a few minutes walk from all of the city's most famous museums and monuments. Sant'Ambrogio open-air fruit and vegetable market, post office and general shopping are withing 5-10 minutes walking distance. The apartment, built in the early renaissance period, is situated near several theatres, the main ones being "Il Teatro Verdi" and "La Pergola". More information.



# BEST PARADE FOR JANUARY: THE CAVALCADE OF THE THREE KINGS ARRIVES IN FLORENCE, January 6

This special parade recreates the arrival of the Three Kings in Bethlehem to the manger where the baby Jesus was born. The "Cavalcade of the Three Kings" takes place in downtown Florence on the morning of January 6 and is a commemoration of an ancient celebration of the epiphany that has taken place in the city as far back as 1400. On this special occasion, a parade in beautiful Renaissance costumes starts from Palazzo Pitti and winds its way through the city, passing by Piazza della Signoria and arriving at the Cathedral and Baptistery in Piazza del Duomo. The Sbandieratori, or flag-throwing company, of the Uffizi also participates in the event, enchanting the public with their skill in throwing, exchanging and waving their flags in Piazza della Signoria. The procession begins at 14.15 from Palazzo Pitti.

# RIDE THE SCENIC FERRIS WHEEL AND ENJOY THE ICE SKATING RINK AT FLORENCE ICE VILLAGE, FORTEZZA DEL BASSO, Until January 15

The Florence Ice Village, with the return of the Ferris wheel and Europe's longest ice rink to Florence, is located in the gardens of the Fortezza da Basso, a short walk from the historical centre. The Florence Giant Ferris Wheel is 55 metres high, but the novelty this year is that the big merry-goround, the nearby ice rink and the Florence Ice Village Christmas Village are greener. The energy used comes from renewable sources, from Italian photovoltaic and wind power plants thanks to a Florentine start-up. Green solutions have also been chosen for the attractions: LED lights for the impressive 'Florence Eye', state-of-the-art ice machines that drastically reduce consumption for the ice ring around the Swan Lake. Also confirmed is Florence's ice skating rink, which at 1,500 metres, all around the fountain in the Fortezza gardens, is the longest in Europe. It was set up for the first time in the city three years ago. The Ferris wheel and skating rink are open until 15 January 2022 daily from 10 a.m. to 24 p.m.

### NEW YEARS DAY CONCERT BY THE ORCHESTRA DELLA TOSCANA

The Orchestra della Toscana maintains its tradition of being the first to open the New Year in its Teatro Verdi in Florence in 2023. On the programme are arias and dances from the great operas of Giuseppe Verdi, Amilcare Ponchielli and Giacomo Puccini, with which we are all familiar: Vespri siciliani, Macbeth, Manon Lescaut, Tosca, Bohème. On the podium, conductor Gianluca Marcianò directs the orchestra and the voices of soprano Viktorija Miškūnaitė, born in Lithuania in 1983, and Leonardo Caimi, a tenor from Calabria, a talent already appreciated worldwide. ### THE HISTORICAL PARADE OF SAN ZANOBI, January 26

A traditional ceremony to commemorate the transfer of the body of St. Zanobi. The historical parade reaches the column of San Zanobi, next to the Baptistery, laying a floral decoration on the spot where the miracle of the elm tree took place. The Historical Procession of the Florentine Republic, the Uffizi Flagwavers and the city authorities, will go to lay a floral tribute, following the following route: Departing at h. 10:50 - from Palagio di Parte Guelfa, then passing through Piazza del Duomo to arrive at the Colonna di San Zanobi. After the laying of the Wreath by the Florentine Madonnas, the Uffizi Flag Wavers will perform. At h. 11:30 they will make the return journey - Piazza San Giovanni, Piazza Duomo, Via Calzaiuoli, Piazza della Signoria, Via Vacchereccia, Mercato Nuovo, Via Porta Rossa, Via Pellicceria, Piazzetta di Parte Guelfa.

# "F-LIGHT - RIFLESSIONI: DOVE SIAMO, DOVE ANDREMO": THE FESTIVAL OF LIGHT THAT ILLUMINATES FLORENCE, Until January 8

Until January 8th Florentines and tourists will be invited to take part in a light journey, an imaginary trip from the city's squares to the celestial vault. After the great success of the last editions, Florence

is preparing to light up with "F-Light": the Florence Light Festival will shed new light on the monuments and squares of the city. The event will offer video-mapping, projections, light games, artistic installations, educational activities, special visits to museums, shows and cultural meetings. As usual, many spaces of the city will be involved: on all Ponte Vecchio, Palazzo Vecchio, Palazzo Medici Riccardi, Piazza Santa Maria Novella and the Oltrarno, with particular attention to the Towers and the city gates and the neighborhoods outside the historic center.

### ST. JAVELIN BY JULIA KRAHN SHOWING AT MUSEO NOVECENTO, Until January 23

From <u>The Florentine</u>: "A new exhibition, *St. Javelin*, has opened up at Museo Novecento. Curated by Sergio Risaliti and presenting images by German artist Julia Krahn, these powerful bodies of work are on display until January 29, 2023." The exhibition is sectioned in two parts, the first, which is displayed above the outside terrace of the museum, is a series of 10 flags each wearing the portraits

of Ukrainian female refugees. The 10 women in each of the photos differ in age, appearance and experience, yet all share the unfortunate common ground of being impacted by the progressing Ukrainian war. Each portrait oozes with dignity and tenacity, which has not been lost, despite surviving insurmountably difficult events. Read the full article here.

### **ESCHER ON SHOW AT MUSEO DEGLI INNOCENTI, Until March 2023**

The Museo degli Innocenti in Florence hosts an anthological exhibition dedicated to the brilliant Dutch artist Maurits Cornelis Escher. The spaces of the historic Museo degli Innocenti will host more than 200 works by the Dutch artist, who was discovered by the general public in recent years and has become one of the most beloved artists worldwide. In his famous engravings and lithographs Escher creates a unique, imaginative, impossible world where art, mathematics, science, physics and design converge, as well as representing Italy in many of his works. #### INSIDE BANKSY: AN IMMERSIVE MULTIMEDIA EXPERIENCE

The Cathedral of the Image will become the home of the world's street art by hosting, within the monumental complex of Santo Stefano al Ponte, the world premiere of the unauthorized immersive digital exhibition dedicated to the subversive and satirical British writer Banksy. Inside Banksy is a spectacular immersive event realised by Crossmedia with the curatorial contribution of Gianni Mercurio, in which the creative path Banksy is told: the most subversive and satirical artist on the world street art scene. # ANTONIO SIGNORINI IN PIAZZA DEL CARMINE, PIAZZA SAN FIRENZE, PIAZZA DEL GRANO, AND NEW CONTEMPORARY GALLERY, OBLONG

The squares of Florence are currently dancing with the elegant figures of warriors, dancers and horses, carrying with them hope, lightness and the energy of life. *Attraverso* is the work of Antonio Signorini, a Tuscany-born artist who has returned home to showcase seven monumental sculptures in the streets of Florence, with a collection of smaller pieces in the new Florence seat of global contemporary art gallery, OBLONG. Florence is the third location for the OBLONG galleries, also in Dubai and Forte dei Marmi, who have taken over the old Cavalli supper club in piazza del Carmine and transformed the space into a modern luxury gallery experience. ### **OLAFUR ELIASSON, NEL TUO TEMPO, AT PALAZZO STROZZI, Until January 2023**

Palazzo Strozzi hosts Olafur Eliasson - Nel Tuo Tempo, the largest exhibition in Italy dedicated to one of the most original and visionary artists of our time. The Icelandic-Danish artist works with sculpture, painting, photography, video, installations and digital media. His art is driven by his interest in perception, movement, lived experience, his own feelings and those of the community. His practice therefore involves the public through architectural projects, interventions in public spaces, and artistic, social and environmental education. Website.

### **TONY CRAGG AT MUSEO NOVECENTO, Until January 2023**

Museo Novecento presents one of the greatest international sculptors, Tony Cragg (Liverpool, 1949). His extensive monographic exhibition, Transfer presents a selection of sculptures and works on paper by the English master. His is particularly well-known for helping to revive the language of sculpture by introducing new materials and techniques, some of the most experimental and innovative of our time. The project is absolutely unprecedented, designed as a mediation tool to present not only the artist's works (sculptures and drawings) but also show his creative process. Website.

## PASSIONE NOVECENTO. FROM PAUL KLEE TO DAMIEN HIRST, WORKS FROM PRIVATE COLLECTIONS. Until January 2023

At Palazzo Medici Riccardi, where modern collecting was born at the time of Cosimo the Elder and Lorenzo II Magnifico the exhibition Passione Novecento. From Paul Klee to Damien Hirst, curated by Sergio Risaliti, Director of the Museo Novecento, will be inaugurated. The exhibition houses a prestigious selection of works by 20th century masters from private Florentine and Tuscan collections. A journey into the art of the twentieth century that continues, through a common thread, the history of the city where the artistic events and those of private collecting have been intertwined over the centuries. A precious opportunity to admire works by: Paul Klee, Giorgio de Chirico, Giorgio Morandi, Alberto Savinio, Lucio Fontana, Alberto Burri, together with Andy Warhol e Roy Lichenstein, Cecily Brown and Tracey Emin. ### HONOURING WANDA FERRAGAMO: WOMEN IN BALANCE 1955-1965

The new Museo Ferragamo exhibition showing until 18 April 2023 is dedicated to the figure of Wanda Miletti Ferragamo: Wanda Ferragamo took over the reins of the family business when her husband died, transforming an artisan women's shoe workshop into a fashion house, thus changing her own life and that of her family. Starting from her figure, the exhibition describes the female reality in Italy between the 1950s and the 1960s, in the light of the deep socio-economic changes that characterised the years of the economic boom, with women searching for new life models, searching for a balance between work and family life. Guided tours are available both in person (Italian, English, French and Spanish) and online (Italian and English only). Reservation (by phone or e-mail) is compulsory. More information.
