

BEST EVENT: IL CARNEVALE CELEBRATIONS IN VIAREGGIO! From February 4

The celebrations for II Carnevale happen all over Tuscany, but by far the most famous and exciting is the famed Carnevale in Viareggio. There are many chances to see the Masked Parade in February, with 5 days of processions spread over the month as well as the "Great Ending Fireworks". If there was ever a time to make the trip outside of Florence, this is it. The parades, parties, fireworks, masked balls, theatre, and culinary events are truly over-the-top. Wear clothes you don't care too much about, because it's a given that you'll end up sprayed with foam and sprinkled with confetti! Old, young, and everyone in-between, joins in the silliness. BEST TRADITION: CALCIO STORICO HONOURS THE BATTLE OF THE SIEGE, February 17

*Still unconfirmed for 2023, but a great event if it goes ahead this year! The Calcio Storico honour a historical siege with the Annual Partita dell'Assedio. It was the siege of Holy Roman Emperor Charles V, on the 17th of February 1530 that gave us both the custom of changing the guard but also strengthened the tradition of this famous game of Calcio Storico reenacted every year between the four factions of Florence. Intended as a statement of indifference to the danger that stalked the city outside of the city walls, these events had a strong symbolic impact of solidarity on those within the boundaries. "The Battle of the Siege", when Florence struggled without allies against the Imperial troops of Charles V, signalled the return of the Medici family after their exile. Even under the stress of the battle, the match served as a challenge to the foreign troops, demonstrating just how little the

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Florentines felt the weight of threat just beyond its walls – even though they eventually fell in August 1530. This game, a mix of soccer, rugby and American-styled football will be reenacted in traditional Bianco and Verde costume (the Green team against the White team) on the 17th of February in front of the Santa Croce Church at 2 pm.

BEST ANNIVERSARY: FLORENCE HONOURS ANNA MARIA LUISA DE MEDICI, February 18

February 18 celebrates the greatest patroness of the arts in Florence history, Anna Maria Luisa de' Medici. The last of the ruling line of the Medici, she left behind an extraordinary legacy in the form of The Family Pact, which bequeathed the considerable artistic patrimony of the family, accrued over three centuries, to the city of Florence. The Pact was to prevent any of the patrimony from being removed from Florence or the state of Tuscany. Instead, she insisted, everything must remain in Florence, for all time, "for the use of the public and to attract the curiosity of foreigners." In honour of Anna Maria Luisa, Florence opens its Civic Museums with free entry for the public on the day of her death, February 18. Be sure to include a visit to the Medici Chapels to pay your respects. Civic museums: Palazzo Vecchio, Museo del Novecento, Brancacci Chapel, Santa Maria Novella, Museo Stefano Bardini. BEST FESTIVAL: 8th EDITION OF BLACK HISTORY MONTH FLORENCE, Until March

Black History Month Florence is a cross institutional network for Black cultural production that celebrates the diversity of Afro-descendent Cultures in the context of Italy. The initiative is engaged in programming, advising and co-promoting over 50 events annually within the month of February, through a network formed and supported by the Comune, foundations, institutions, cultural associations, museums, schools and venues dedicated to art and to music. Black History Month Florence is broken down into BHMF Film, BHMF Art, BHMF Workshop, BHMF Talk, BHMF Food, BHMF Tours, BHMF Kids and BHMF Theatre/Dance forming a community dedicated to challenging flattened narratives about African and African Diasporic cultures and disseminating culturally diverse programming. BEST PARADE: CHANGING OF THE GUARD IN PIAZZA DELLA SIGNORIA, February 3

The Changing of the Guard begins with a parade through the streets of Florence, and then ends with the traditional ceremony of the Changing of the Guard. Enjoy the spectacle of drums and costumes as the "Gonfalone", the Banner of Florence, or the Historical Parade of the Florentine Republic, arrives in the centre of the Arengario, in front of Palazzo Vecchio. There are two armed soldiers positioned on either side, together with the captain and an officer who complete the Guard. Find the times and routes here.

THE FLORENCE INTERNATIONAL MUSIC AND ARTS FESTIVAL, XIX EDITION, February 10-12

The II Trillo Music School and Florence International Arts Expo, directed by tenor Cigon Kim, present the 2023 edition of the festival dedicated to traditional Korean and European music. During the festival there will be classical and modern music masterclasses, music therapy training sessions held by teachers from the school and guest lecturers, design courses and art exhibitions. TASTE 2023, THREE DAYS DEDICATED TO JAZZY TASTES AT THE FORTEZZA DI BASSO, February 4-6

Taste, the three-day event dedicated to the excellence of taste, is back. The theme of this edition of Taste, from 4 to 6 February 2023 at the Fortezza da Basso in Florence, is Jazz music, which gives its name to the title of the kermesse: Jazzy Taste is tastes, perfumes, flavours that are sought after, cultivated, invented and rediscovered in continuous experimentation and involving experiences, and focused on the choral nature of the five senses. EXHIBITIONS

SAURO CAVALLINI'S WORKS ON DISPLAY FOR THE FIRST TIME IN FLORENCE, AT THE PALAZZO STROZZI SACRATI IN PIAZZA DEL DUOMO, Until February 28

Sauro Cavallini, one of the most prolific artists of the second half of the 20th century, experienced the horror of extermination camps during the Second World War: in September 1943 at the age of 16, he was arrested by the fascist police and imprisoned in the Gradaro camp in Mantua, where he remained for about a year. The months of imprisonment profoundly marked Cavallini's life and when he began to practise sculpture, the nightmares of imprisonment took shape and resulted in his first works of art that he would not repeat in the more than 50 years that followed. Today, those works take on a value as a testimony to a particularly painful past and 16 of those iron and brass works, created between 1961 and 1963, will be exhibited for the first time in Florence in the exhibition scheduled from 26 January to 28 February 2023 in the rooms of Palazzo Strozzi Sacrati, seat of the presidency of the Regional Council of Tuscany. <u>Website</u>.

ESCHER ON SHOW AT MUSEO DEGLI INNOCENTI, Until March 2023

The Museo degli Innocenti in Florence hosts an anthological exhibition dedicated to the brilliant Dutch artist Maurits Cornelis Escher. The spaces of the historic Museo degli Innocenti will host more than 200 works by the Dutch artist, who was discovered by the general public in recent years and has become one of the most beloved artists worldwide. In his famous engravings and lithographs Escher creates a unique, imaginative, impossible world where art, mathematics, science, physics and design converge, as well as representing Italy in many of his works. 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INSIDE BANKSY: AN IMMERSIVE MULTIMEDIA EXPERIENCE

The Cathedral of the Image will become the home of the world's street art by hosting, within the monumental complex of Santo Stefano al Ponte, the world premiere of the unauthorized immersive digital exhibition dedicated to the subversive and satirical British writer Banksy. Inside Banksy is a spectacular immersive event realised by Crossmedia with the curatorial contribution of Gianni Mercurio, in which the creative path Banksy is told: the most subversive and satirical artist on the world street art scene. A real story that unfolds through a wise mix of images, sounds, music that can immediately evoke underground culture of Bristol. Website.

HONOURING WANDA FERRAGAMO: WOMEN IN BALANCE 1955-1965

The new Museo Ferragamo exhibition showing until 18 April 2023 is dedicated to the figure of Wanda Miletti Ferragamo: Wanda Ferragamo took over the reins of the family business when her husband died, transforming an artisan women's shoe workshop into a fashion house, thus changing her own life and that of her family. Starting from her figure, the exhibition describes the female reality in Italy between the 1950s and the 1960s, in the light of the deep socio-economic changes that characterised the years of the economic boom, with women searching for new life models, searching for a balance between work and family life. Guided tours are available both in person (Italian, English, French and Spanish) and online (Italian and English only). Reservation (by phone or e-mail) is compulsory. More information.

CONCERT FOR THE HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY AT PALAZZO PITTI, February 12

On Sunday **12 February**, the Shaboruz Quartet (Scuola di Musica di Fiesole) present and important concert in the Sala Bianca of the Palatine Gallery and Royal Apartments in **Palazzo Pitti**, for the Holocaust Remembrance Day, with which the Shoah tragedy is commemorated every year. The concert is an initiative of the Embassy of the Republic of Germany in Italy and organised by the Scuola di Musica di Fiesole in collaboration with the Jewish Community of Florence and Le Gallerie degli Uffizi. PERFORMANCES AT TEATRO VERDI

The 'Teatro Pagliano' assumed its current name, 'Teatro Verdi,' in 1901. It was built during the Grand Ducal period in Florence on the former site of the fourteenth century Stinche Prison. Our pick for this month:

Casanova, the Pop Opera - The musical theatre colossal set in 18th-century Venice and dedicated to one of the world's best-known Italian characters, GIACOMO CASANOVA, brings 21 performers to the stage, 2 hours of music and 35 songs sung live, 120 costumes, 30 scene changes, immersive sets and innovative stylistic choices.

THEATRE AND MUSIC AT TEATRO DELLA PERGOLA

The Teatro della Pergola is a historic opera house in Florence, Italy, built in 1656 under the patronage of Cardinal Gian Carlo de' Medici. Just one of the offerings this month:

Come Tu Mi Vuoi - A masterpiece of Luigi Pirandello, perhaps by far the least performed, chosen by director Luca De Fusco who frequently presents works by the Sicilian author. He brings this piece to the stage with Lucia Lavia, the protagonist of a dark and existentialist performance, closer than ever to our times.

MAGGIO MUSICALE FIORENTINO

The Theatre of the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino owes its name to the prestigious Maggio Musicale Festival, the oldest in Italy, a first that it shares in Europe with the festivals of Salzburg and Bayreuth. Founded in Florence in 1933, the festival quickly became a centre of dissemination of the great European musical culture indicating and proposing new and unconventional ideas, in regards to classical repertoire and contemporary compositions.
