BEST EVENT: FESTA DELLA DONNA, March 8

Shower the streets in yellow! March 8 is celebrated as International Women's Day, and in Italy it is known as the Festa della Donna. get ready for spring colour because the symbol is the bright yellow mimosa flower. Fifteen million bunches of mimosa are bought each year to honour the women of Italy. It was the idea of Teresa Mattei, a partisan in WWII, who held the rank of Company Commander in the Garibaldi Youth Front. It was proposed that violets be the flower, but she said it should be a flower readily available to all, even the poorest of the poor, growing wild in March all over the country. She was the youngest person elected to the Constitutional Assembly after the war and was also the national leader of the Union of Italian Women. BEST ANNIVERSARY: CAPODANNO! THE FLORENTINE NEW YEAR AND THE FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION, March 25

It's time to celebrate! Still today, Florence celebrates a special New Year's Tradition on March 25th at Piazza della Santissima Annunziata. Until 1750, the beginning of the calendar year would fall on March 25, roughly coinciding with the arrival of spring. This date is also the day of Christ's conception with the Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary, exactly nine months before the birth of Jesus. Although the Gregorian calendar was introduced in 1502, the Florentines have held to their tradition and continue to celebrate Capodanno Fiorentino on March 25th. Between 1250 and 1750, Florentines would gather at the Church of the Santissima Annunziata, where there is a famous medieval mural of the Annunciation. According to legend, the artist fell asleep having completed everything on the mural except for the face of the Madonna. When he awoke, the face of the Virgin Mary had been completed for him by angelic masters. And so, even today, citizens and authorities come on this day to pay tribute to the Madonna. BEST EXHIBITION: CARLO LEVI'S UNDERCOVER LIFE AT PALAZZO MEDICI RICCARDI

Until the 19 March, Palazzo Medici Riccardi is hosting an exhibition dedicated to the anti-fascist intellectual Carlo Levi. The exhibition is dedicated to Carlo Levi's stay in Florence (1941 - 1945), during the war years and the Nazi occupation up to the Liberation struggle. In Florence, in the last year of the Second World War, Levi wrote his first and best-known book, Christ Stopped at Eboli, in which he evokes faces, stories and characters from his confinement in Grassano and Aliano in Lucania: a shattering experience that led him to discover the peasant and archaic Italy confined in a south living outside the times of history and struggling to relate to the imperial mythology imposed by fascism. BEST FESTIVAL: LA DEMOCRAZIA DEL CORPO DANCE FESTIVAL

From February to May, enjoy the international Festival La Democrazia del Corpo ("Democracy of the Body") by Virgilio Sieni. The "Democracy of the Body" proposes a cycle of performance works intended as excursions exploring the body. This year the festival returns to the central theme of the artists themselves, those who research and build bridges with history: passages that are understood as meeting places that are always open and poetically in mutation, where the reference to the body, to musical form, to gravity, to the philosophy of space, to its care and way of hosting the other, creates the initiatory gesture of encounter and relationship. All of Italy refers to the father figure as *papà*, in fact it is only in Tuscany that they use the word *Babbo* (even Pinocchio, born in Collodi Tuscany, used this endearment when talking to his father). Italy celebrates all fathers/papà/babbo on the holy day dedicated to San Giuseppe (St. Joseph) which is March 19th. So give your Dad a hug (or a call, if he isn't with you in Tuscany now) and head over to the pastry shops which will be filled with "*fritelle*", fried dough and rice balls covered in sugar.

8th EDITION OF BLACK HISTORY MONTH FLORENCE, Until March

Black History Month Florence is a cross institutional network for Black cultural production that celebrates the diversity of Afro-descendent Cultures in the context of Italy. The initiative is engaged in programming, advising and co-promoting over 50 events annually within the month of February, through a network formed and supported by the Comune, foundations, institutions, cultural associations, museums, schools and venues dedicated to art and to music. Black History Month Florence is broken down into BHMF Film, BHMF Art, BHMF Workshop, BHMF Talk, BHMF Food, BHMF Tours, BHMF Kids and BHMF Theatre/Dance forming a community dedicated to challenging flattened narratives about African and African Diasporic cultures and disseminating culturally diverse programming. TRAM-E D'ARTE: GUIDED TOURS OF LESSER-KNOWN FLORENCE BY TRAM

Until March, three guided journeys along Florence's tram-lines to discover a new, sustainable, and conscious way to see a lesser known, but fascinating side of the city, as well as its more contemporary aspects. The free guided tours will be offered in both Italian and English held by certified and knowledgable local guides, and will be held from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00/12:30 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays. #DOMENICOALMUSEO: STATE MUSEUMS FREE FOR EVERYONE, AND CIVIC MUSEUMS FREE FOR RESIDENTS ON THE FIRST SUNDAY OF EVERY MONTH

On the first Sunday of every month, Florence opens up all of its state and civic museums free for residents of the city, or people born here. Here's a list of the state museums free to all: Uffizi, Accademia, Bargello, Medici Chapels, Pitti Palace (all museums), San Marco, Palazzo Davanzati, Medici Villas. And civic museums free to residents: Palazzo Vecchio, Arnolfo Tower, Santa Maria Novella, Stefano Bardini Museum, Fondazione Salvatore Romano, Museo del Novecento, Brancacci Chapel in Santa Maria del Carmine. EXHIBITIONS

GIACOMETTI - FONTATA. SEARCHING FOR THE ABSOLUTE, Until June 4

From 2 March to 4 June 2023, the exhibition Giacometti - Fontana. The Quest for the Absolute, curated by Chiara Gatti and Sergio Risaliti, will be on display in the monumental spaces of the Museo di Palazzo Vecchio, specifically in the Sala delle Udienze and the Sala dei Gigli. For the first time, these two pillars of the 20th century, so distant in their attitudes and in their lives, but equally linked by a reflection on the truth in art, conquered through the experience of matter and imagination at the same time, poised between the primordial dimension of time and the cosmological dimension of space, will be brought together. LIGHT, GAZE, PRESENCE, Y.Z. KAMI ON DISPLAY ACROSS FLORENCE, Until September

The exhibition of Y.Z. Kami (Tehran, 1956) presents a selection of works exhibited for the first time in Florence in some of the city's most beautiful sights: Museo Novecento, Museo di Palazzo Vecchio, Museo degli Innocenti and, exceptionally, in the millenary Abbazia di San Miniato al Monte (from 17 February to 24 September 2023). The exhibition is a journey into the pictorial universe of the Iranian-American artist, who has lived and worked in New York since the 1980s. With a selection of 24 works located in some of the most prestigious Florentine cultural institutions, Light, Gaze, Presence brings together some of the main strands of Y.Z.'s artistic research. Kami in a close dialogue with the extraordinary medieval and renaissance masterpieces housed there.

ESCHER ON SHOW AT MUSEO DEGLI INNOCENTI, Until March 2023

The Museo degli Innocenti in Florence hosts an anthological exhibition dedicated to the brilliant Dutch artist Maurits Cornelis Escher. The spaces of the historic Museo degli Innocenti will host more than 200 works by the Dutch artist, who was discovered by the general public in recent years and has become one of the most beloved artists worldwide. In his famous engravings and lithographs Escher creates a unique, imaginative, impossible world where art, mathematics, science, physics and design converge, as well as representing Italy in many of his works. INSIDE BANKSY: AN IMMERSIVE MULTIMEDIA EXPERIENCE

The Cathedral of the Image will become the home of the world's street art by hosting, within the monumental complex of Santo Stefano al Ponte, the world premiere of the unauthorized immersive digital exhibition dedicated to the subversive and satirical British writer Banksy. Inside Banksy is a spectacular immersive event realised by Crossmedia with the curatorial contribution of Gianni Mercurio, in which the creative path Banksy is told: the most subversive and satirical artist on the world street art scene. A real story that unfolds through a wise mix of images, sounds, music that can immediately evoke underground culture of Bristol. Website.

HONOURING WANDA FERRAGAMO: WOMEN IN BALANCE 1955-1965

The new Museo Ferragamo exhibition showing until 18 April 2023 is dedicated to the figure of Wanda Miletti Ferragamo: Wanda Ferragamo took over the reins of the family business when her husband died, transforming an artisan women's shoe workshop into a fashion house, thus changing her own life and that of her family. Starting from her figure, the exhibition describes the female reality in Italy between the 1950s and the 1960s, in the light of the deep socio-economic changes that characterised the years of the economic boom, with women searching for new life models, searching for a balance between work and family life. Guided tours are available both in person (Italian, English, French and Spanish) and online (Italian and English only). Reservation (by phone or e-mail) is compulsory. More information.

FIRENZE SUONA MUSIC CONTEST, Until May

Firenze Suona Music Contest is an original music competition for young Italian groups and soloists. From November to January, across all of Italy, young musicians and bands have been fighting it out to be chosen for the finals. Now the final selection will give us their best during seven events of live music in Firenze from March 5 to May 14. The selection evenings and semifinals will take place in Florence at the LE MURATE literary café, on Sundays in March and 2 and 16 April 2023 respectively, while the final will be on 14 May at VIPER. PERFORMANCES AT TEATRO VERDI

The 'Teatro Pagliano' assumed its current name, 'Teatro Verdi,' in 1901. It was built during the Grand Ducal period in Florence on the former site of the fourteenth century Stinche Prison. Our pick for this month:

LEGALLY BLONDE - THE MUSICAL - After the great success on Broadway and after the International Awards won in London's West End, Legally Blonde, La rivincita delle bionde, a tribute to the ability and willpower of women, finally arrives in Italy. Elle Woods is a vivacious, fashionable, sweet and above all blonde girl. President of the sorority at the University of California, she seems to have everything she wants until her life is turned upside down by her boyfriend who, not taking her seriously enough, leaves her to attend law school at Harvard. Determined to win him back, Elle uses her wits and charm to get into the prestigious university in turn.

The Teatro della Pergola is a historic opera house in Florence, Italy, built in 1656 under the patronage of Cardinal Gian Carlo de' Medici. Just one of the offerings this month:

MAGGIO MUSICALE FIORENTINO

The Theatre of the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino owes its name to the prestigious Maggio Musicale Festival, the oldest in Italy, a first that it shares in Europe with the festivals of Salzburg and Bayreuth. Founded in Florence in 1933, the festival quickly became a centre of dissemination of the great European musical culture indicating and proposing new and unconventional ideas, in regards to classical repertoire and contemporary compositions.
