BEST ANNIVERSARY: THE FESTA DELLA REPUBBLICA, CELEBRATING ITALIAN INDEPENDENCE DAY, June 2

The day commemorates the institutional referendum held by universal suffrage in 1946, in which the Italian people were called to the polls to decide on the form of government, following the Second World War and the fall of Fascism. With 12,717,923 votes for a republic and 10,719,284 for the monarchy, the male descendants of the House of Savoy were sent into exile.

BEST TRADITION: LA FESTA DI SAN GIOVANNI, PATRON SAINT OF FLORENCE, June 24

The patron saint of Florence, John the Baptist, is celebrated on June 24. Traditionally there is a parade to the Baptistry in the morning and another before the Historic Soccer (Calcio Storico) game

in the afternoon, although this year the celebrations are likely to be more limited. The Calcio Storico will happen instead in September, due to the pandemic.

From <u>Visit Florence</u>: The celebration feast of St. John has **ancient origins**: nobles and lords would celebrate the patron saint of the city by donating large "candles" or votive offerings called *ceri* in Italian to the churches, consider back when there was no electricity and this was the only way to light an interior. Churches needed lots of candles, it was a large expense. With the growth of the city's importance, the candles became larger, more beautifully decorated and valuable. Some were made especially for the Baptistery (which is dedicated to the saint) and others were made especially to be sold. All funds were donated to the Church. BEST EXHIBITION: AMERICAN ART 1961-2001 OPENS AT THE PALAZZO STROZZI

A major exhibition taking a new perspective on the history of contemporary art in the United States. The exhibition brings together an outstanding selection of more than 80 works by 55 artists including Andy Warhol, Mark Rothko, Louise Nevelson, Roy Lichtenstein, Claes Oldenburg, Bruce Nauman, Barbara Kruger, Robert Mapplethorpe, Cindy Sherman, Matthew Barney, Kara Walker and many more, exhibited in Florence through a collaboration with the Walker Art Center in Minneapolis. Exhibiting many formative works for the first time in Italy, the exhibition examines the most important figures and movements that marked the development of American art from the beginning of the Vietnam War until the 9/11 attack. The vaccination program is now charging ahead, with everyone over 40 now registered for their vaccine dates and a number of open days where people over 40 and over 60 can go and have their vaccine without a reservation. On the first week of June, reservations will open for people in their 30s. PROGETTO RIVA CELEBRATES THE ARNO RIVER IN FLORENCE, Until June 19

The RIVA project was created with the aim of enhancing the banks of the River Arno, in the heart of Florence and the metropolitan area. In 1966 the city lived through the terrible experience of the flood, with more than a hundred victims and the damage or destruction of thousands of art masterpieces and rare books. With the joint effort of Italian and foreign volunteers, many of these works have been restored, but decades later there is still much work to be done. After this tragedy, the city has in fact forgotten the banks of the Arno, observing it 'from afar', losing all intimacy with the river. For years the RIVA Project has stimulated a critical and interdisciplinary investigation that lays the foundations for the design of a river park in the heart of the city, through the participation of Italian and foreign artists, curators, scientists, biologists and architects. BEAUTIFUL LIES - ALI BANISADIR, ON DISPLAY AT PALAZZO VECCHIO'S SALA DEI GIGLI, AND THE MUSEO STEFANO BARDINI, Until August

Beautiful Lies is one of the works inspired by Dante that will be exhibited in the Sala dei Gigli of Palazzo Vecchio, chosen to give the title to the entire exhibition. The 'beautiful lie' under which the truth is hidden is an expression used by Dante to talk about his works and allegorical poems that fits perfectly with Banisadr's work. TITIANA MASELLI, SALVATORE FERRAGAMO AND THE MYTH OF GRETA GARBO, Until August

The chapel and the room on the second floor of the museum host **Étoile**. The starting point of the project is the large canvas made by **Titina Maselli** and dedicated to **Greta Garbo**. Like a black and white photo, the painting introduces us to the mysterious and magnetic world of one of the most famous stars of international cinema. Style icon and model of original and unconventional femininity, Greta Garbo linked her career to Salvatore Ferragamo, a stylist who knew how to interpret with extreme accuracy the style and personality of the great Hollywood actress. For the occasion, in a box like a small casket, the Museum shows some shoes designed by Salvatore Ferragamo for Greta Garbo. Website.

SILK, ON DISPLAY AT THE SALVATORE FERRAGAMO MUSEUM, Until April 2022

Seta' celebrates the silk prints of the Salvatore Ferragamo maison of which Fulvia Visconti Ferragamo was the creator and creative soul. Through the history of its founder and the historical archive, the Ferragamo Museum intends to express the continuous relationship between art and fashion, proposing a dialogue between tradition and modernity. The exhibition tour tells the perfect union of fanciful intuitions, and high industrial craftsmanship that is behind the production of a scarf - and any silk print - beyond the infinite inspirations that are at the origin of each design. In the first section the exhibition hosts the 'site specific' installation by Chinese artists Sun yuan & Peng Yu entitled 'Were creatures born celestial?' which exemplify conceptually what fertile ground of encounter and exchange between East and West was the Silk Route. THE BARGELLO FOR DANTE, May 11 - August 8

(from: theflorentine.net) Forming part of the line-up to honour Dante Alighieri on the 700th anniversary of his death, this exhibition at the <u>Bargello Museum</u> looks at the relationship between Dante and his Florence, as well as the years following the death of the Supreme Poet pieced together through manuscripts and works of art. Part of the display will be set up inside the Podestà Chapel in a suitable setting for one of the world's greatest literary figures. Free workshops for children and families are dedicated to the discovery of Dante and 14th-century Florence.

TURANDOT AND THE FANTASTIC EAST OF PUCCINI, CHINI, AND CARAMBA, May 22

Dazzling costumes and glittering jewels prevail in this multidisciplinary and wide-ranging exhibition that details the Tuscan composer Giacomo Puccini's path to choosing the painter Galileo Chini as set designer and Luigi Sapelli (known as Caramba) as costume designer for the world premiere of Puccini's much-loved masterpiece, *Turandot*. SEE CONTEMPORARY ARTIST JR'S NEW INSTALLATION ON THE FACADE OF PALAZZO STROZZI, AND GIUSEPPE PENONE'S TRIBUTE TO DANTE IN PIAZZA DELLA SIGNORIA

Zona rossa art is street art, as we again remain at home and galleries and museums are closed. However we are allowed to walk and ride our bikes for exercise, within our own comune, so for some that means they can walk past two large scale but very different art installation pieces, that are generating vastly diverse responses! JR's work, "La Ferita", uses photography to open a "tear" in the wall of Palazzo Strozzi through which hidden corners and an imagined exhibition of major works are able to be seen. Penone, on the other hand, has installed a tall sculpture of a tree, stark and bare, inspired by the lines "l'albero che vive de la cima / e frutta sempre e mai non perde foglia" from Paradiso in Dante's The Divine Comedy. JR's piece is receiving overwhelmingly positive responses, as it offers a glimpse of beauty in troubled times. The tree, however, is creating a very different stir! Have a chuckle at some of the ironic responses including "It's missing the vultures and condors on the branches," or "At first glance it seemed like an abandoned antenna." in this article by Wanted In Rome.

MICHELANGELO LIVES AGAIN THANKS TO ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

(from feelflorence.it) More than 500 years after his birth (6 march 1475) Michelangelo 'lives again', and is ready to answer your questions! This is not fake news, but a joint project of the Opera di Santa Maria del Fiore (florence Cathedral Foundation) and Querlo, Customized Artificial Intelligence Solutions based in New York, who for the first time ever have realized a virtual Michelangelo, using Artificial Ingtelligence technology. The idea of Michelangelo AI was born in the Covid-19 period. The global travel restrictions have had a devastating impact making it impossible for people to visit special cities like Michelangelo's Florence. Michelangelo AI is an educational tool available to all who want to know something about the art, life and thought of the greatest Renaissance artist. In turn, Michelangelo AI will learn from these conversations, continually increasing his range of knowledge. A RIVEDER LE STELLE, ONLINE EXHIBITION HOSTED BY THE UFFIZI

On the occasion of the 700th anniversary of the death of the Great Poet, the Uffizi is offering a virtual exhibition dedicated to the 88 drawings cycle known as Dante Istoriato by Federico Zuccari. Completed between 1586 and 1588 in Spain by the author of the frescoes in the dome of Santa Maria del Fiore, the cycle fully illustrates Dante's Comedy, equal only to Sandro Botticelli's and Gustave Doré's 19th-century cycle. In addition to the drawings, texts and comments wrote by the painter on
