BEST EVENT: ESTATE FIORENTINA 2019, THE SUMMER LONG FESTIVAL OF EVENTS AND PERFORMANCES THROUGHOUT FLORENCE

BEST EXHIBITION: LAST CHANCE TO SEE BEYOND PERFORMANCE - REDE SOCIAL AT PALAZZO STROZZI, Until July 14

The **Opavivará!** (Brasil 2005) artists' collective encourages a heavily social use of urban space through the creation of relational works that propose collective performances such as *Rede Social*: a large and extremely colourful hammock measuring over 10 metres and specially designed for the Palazzo Strozzi courtyard. Visitors are urged to play an active part in the installation by climbing into the hammock, where they will naturally tend to interact with the other participants as they move around in it or converse with them in one spot or another. Inspired by Brasilian culture – open, free and strongly collective – the hammock allows visitors to experience the Palazzo from an extremely novel and unusual viewpoint while also offering them a chance to relax, to have fun and to forget their formal role and place in society for a few moments. BEST CONCERT: FESTIVAL AU DÉSERT 2018, 9TH EDITION, July 10-12

The Festival au Désert brings to Florence the magic of music between distant cultures, for three days of rhythms, reflections and socializing. The Festival au Désert in Florence is a multicultural music project that has created a network for contemporary creation between Africa, the Mediterranean and Europe, starting with the collaboration between the Festival au Désert in Essakane (Mali) and the Fabbrica Europa Foundation. Together with this festival, an agreement was established in order to develop a production network and promote new creations that combine the delicate work of transmitting traditions and instrumental techniques nomads, with the most innovative sounds and procedures modulated and experimented in the West. BEST DINING OUT: OSTERIA DE' CICALINI

"Creativity Steps from the Duomo | Osteria de' Cicalini is the new kid on the block in the center, a stone's throw from Brunelleschi's masterpiece. This intimate, atmosphere space is home to a seasonable and great price-for-quality menu that livens up classic Florentine cuisine. Carpaccio with lemongrass, spaghetti alla chittarra with rabbit and zucchini flowers, slow-cooked anchovies and the best egg truffle dish this girl has ever tried in the city. Equally as impressive is the wine list and desserts. The chef is young and while things aren't always refined, I have loved everything I have eaten here. PRIDE PARK AT VILLA LIMONAIA STROZZI

Until July 8

Florence Pride Park is a project that develops on the gay village model already present in Italy. The Pride Park will be a place of gathering and meeting, in which all together can share a rich range of events.

The program offers events and quality initiatives that are not only fun but also raise awareness of LGBT issues. At Pride Park there will be room for everyone and each week has a different theme, divided between entertainment and socio-cultural insights. Pride Park is in the beautiful setting of Limonaia Villa Strozzi, used exclusively for the permanent display of this village.

TORRE DI SAN NICCOLO: CLIMB THE TOWER

Summer is the time that the San Niccolo Tower opens up for visitors. The medieval tower dates back to 1324 and once formed a part of the old walls around the city ? it is the only one of the city towers to retain its original height of 60m (the others were lowered during the siege of 1529 to make them less vulnerable to cannonball fire). This year you can make the climb (around 200 steps) between 5pm and 8pm each day, with visits beginning every 30 minutes.

500 YEARS OF THE MEDICI, ANNIVERSARY FESTIVAL, Until September

The Medici: an ambitious family, grown up between alliances and internal and external struggles for the control of a city state. This year we celebrate two Medici who became princes: Cosimo and Caterina, who were born in the same year: 1519. They were both architects of their own lives thanks to an indomitable spirit forged by raw and violent experiences. Two parallel lives that intersect several times thanks to the strange paths of history and politics, but they have not always been concord meetings. In 2019 more than twenty Florentine institutions - gathered in an Organizing Committee coordinated by the Municipality of Florence with the support of MUS.E - decided to tell these two stories through lectures, exhibitions and events open to the general public in a dense and great program interest.

EXHIBITIONS

VERROCCHIO, THE MASTER OF LEONARDO DA VINCI, AT PALAZZO STROZZI, Until July

The exhibition, with a special section at the Museo Nazionale del Bargello, brings together for the first time Verrocchio's celebrated masterpieces and capital works by the best-known artists associated with his workshop in the second half of the 15th century, such as Domenico Ghirlandaio, Sandro Botticelli, Pietro Perugino and Leonardo da Vinci, his most famous pupil, also reconstructing Leonardo's early artistic career and interaction with his master thanks to outstanding loans and unprecedented juxtapositions.

BEYOND PERFORMANCE: CALLY SPOONER AND MARIO GARCIA TORRES AT THE STROZZINA, Until July 14

Three ways of revisiting the notion of the performance in art today. **Cally Spooner** (United Kingdom, 1983) will be presenting *And You Were Wonderful, On Stage*, a large video installation showing the construction of a film based on a musical, in an ongoing alternation between stage and backstage. **Mario García Torres** (Mexico, 1975) will be presenting *Falling Together in Time*, an installation in which video, painting, music, sculpture and performance art interact in a space that will be brought to life by a series of actions taking place without warning. Bringing the project to a close, the **Opavivarà!** collective (Brasil 2005) will transform the courtyard of Palazzo Strozzi with its installation entitled *Rede Social*, a large and extremely colourful hammock measuring over 10 metres, which the public will be urged to climb into in order to experience the space and architecture of the Palazzo from a new and

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unconventional viewpoint devoid of all hierarchy.

IL PRINCIPE DEI SOGNI: JOSEPH IN THE MEDICI TAPESTRIES BY PONTORMO AND BRONZINO, Until August 29

The twenty Medici tapestries showing the stories of Joseph and realized by some of the most important Renaissance artists, are home once again after over 100 years. They were commissioned and devised by Cosimo I de'Medici for the Sala dei Duecento in Palazzo Vecchio: the last time they were all exposed together was on the occasion of the Unification of Italy and then split up in the following years. The series of twenty tapestries telling the "Stories of Joseph", made in Florence in the sixteenth century, 1545-1553, for Cosimo I de' Medici, represents one of the highest examples of Renaissance art and craftsmanship.

DANCE STEPS. ISADORA DUNCAN AT VILLA BARDINI, Until September 22

Isadora Duncan and the figurative arts in Italy between the nineteenth century and the avant-garde. The first Italian exhibition dedicated to the American dancer Isadora Duncan and her relationship with the Italian figurative arts will host about 170 pieces set on two floors of Villa Bardini and a special section dedicated to large sculptures on display at the Stefano Bardini Museum. By turning her back on romantic ballet, which for centuries had been considered to be the only acceptable dance form, Isadora paved the way for dancers to freely develop their own techniques and unique style. Strong-willed and rebellious against every social norm, she was known for moving about in flowy garments and with bare feet in order to make energetic contact with the earth. A central theme in the exhibition is the liberation of the female body, as inspired by models from the archaeological and classical world. Almost 170 paintings, sculptures and other original documents, including never-before-seen photographs, retrace her links to Italy and its artists. More information here.

TRAJAN'S COLUMN AT BOBOLI GARDENS, Until October 6

The exhibition allows visitors to track the journey of the huge marble blocks that make up the column from the quarries in Luni at an altitude of 800 metres to the Portus Romae – a voyage of some 200 nautical miles – and from there up the Tiber to the heart of the imperial capital. Designed to celebrate Emperor Trajan's military victories in Dacia, the column is also a monument to the technological and building skills of the Roman world.

TONY CRAGG AT BOBOLI GARDENS, Until October 27

Bright steel geysers stand out against the sky of Florence, bronze stalagmites of prehistoric appearance and gigantic resin flowers sprout out of the gravel and between the hedges, colossal and candid stems, hilly eruptions and elliptical shapes, colossal interweaving of imaginary fossil forests, metal flows that shake, twist and fold, caught in the last soft phase before solidify: Tony Cragg's monumental sculptures offer an unexpected dialogue, between associations and dissonances, with the orderly nature of the Boboli

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Gardens and the panorama of the city, between their layered, fragile and organized historical fabric and the primordial force of the sculptural material. <u>More information here</u>.

IL PALIO AT SIENA, July 2 (& August 16)

the most famous Tuscan event ever

It's a horse race in the very heart of the city center, during which the various contrade (or better, quarters or areas in which Siena is divided) challenge in other in what is commonly referred to as a more than a simple challenging game for a local from Siena. Each person who lives in Siena is part of a contrada and, consequently, participates in its life, constantly in competition with the others!! For the occasion, Piazza del Campo (or better, the ring around the square) is covered with tuff clay. The horse race usually takes place in the late afternoon, after the historical parade - composed by more than 600 people in costumes representing the several contrade, that will wind their way through the tiny streets of the center for getting to Piazza del Campo. During the morning, the assigning of the jockey takes place in the presence of the mayor.
