BEST EVENT: DON'T MISS THE NEW GENERATION FESTIVAL 2019, August 28-31

BEST P&F RENTAL: A LIGHT AND SPACIOUS APARTMENT ON A QUIET STREET NEAR TO BUSTLING SAN MARCO SQUARE

BEST TRADITION: THE FEAST OF SAN LORENZO, August 10

San Lorenzo is the co-patron of Florence and every year on 10th August the San Lorenzo district becomes the place of the popular festival par excellence. The Basilica of San Lorenzo, which is also the first consecrated church in the city center, will be the center of all the celebrations. The community comes together in the evening for the traditional distribution of watermelon and lasagna at around 9pm in Piazza San Lorenzo, as well as a concert of classical music in the churchyard. The festivities begin with the Historic Procession of the Florentine Republic that starts at 10am from Piazzetta di Parte Guelfa and arrives at the Basilica in Piazza San Lorenzo, where a holy mass is celebrated.

BEST THEATRE: FLORENCE LIVE THEATRE PRESENTS ITALIAN THEATRE GREATS IN ENGLISH

BEST CONCERT: ESTATE FIESOLANA, Until August 19

BEST HOLIDAY: THE SUMMERTIME FERRAGOSTO NATIONAL HOLIDAY

Known as the day when absolutely everything is closed, Ferragosto is the key date during the Italian summer holidays. The 15th of August is the Feast of the Assumption, and marked the last day of the summer harvest and the start of a well-earned rest, traditionally in the form of a two-week holiday. Now, Italians take their holidays anytime during July to August, but the Ferragosto holiday holds strong and you can expect almost every Italian to have the day off. Do as they do, and treat yourself to a visit to the seaside, a picnic, or a party outdoors!

BEST EXHIBITION: TONY CRAGG AT BOBOLI GARDENS, Until October 27

Bright steel geysers stand out against the sky of Florence, bronze stalagmites of prehistoric appearance and gigantic resin flowers sprout out of the gravel and between the hedges, colossal and candid stems, hilly eruptions and elliptical shapes, colossal interweaving of imaginary fossil forests, metal flows that shake, twist and fold, caught in the last soft phase before solidify: Tony Cragg's monumental sculptures offer an unexpected dialogue, between associations and dissonances, with the orderly nature of the Boboli Gardens and the panorama of the city, between their layered, fragile and organized historical fabric and the primordial force of the sculptural material. BEST DINING OUT: L'OSTERIA CUCINA CASALINGA

This is a fantastic new opening that is already blowing up the internet with great reviews. In the super hip via dei neri strip, L'Osteria is serving very traditional Tuscan cuisine of divine quality. Corso Flaccomio himself hasn't stopped raving since his first visit, and he's been back four times already: "The short menu with a choice from 4 starts, 4 pastas, and 4 meat dishes is spectacular. Especially the beef, grilled as a classic stead, but also the grilled galetto, or the scamerita (pork) are all fantastic." Check it out!

TORRE DI SAN NICCOLO: CLIMB THE TOWER

Summer is the time that the San Niccolo Tower opens up for visitors. The medieval tower dates back to 1324 and once formed a part of the old walls around the city? it is the only one of the city towers to retain its original height of 60m (the others were lowered during the siege of 1529 to make them less vulnerable to cannonball fire). This year you can make the climb (around 200 steps) between 5pm and 8pm each day, with visits beginning every 30 minutes.

500 YEARS OF THE MEDICI, ANNIVERSARY FESTIVAL, Until September

The Medici: an ambitious family, grown up between alliances and internal and external struggles for the control of a city state. This year we celebrate two Medici who became princes: Cosimo and Caterina, who were born in the same year: 1519. They were both architects of their own lives thanks to an indomitable spirit forged by raw and violent experiences. Two parallel lives that intersect several times thanks to the strange paths of history and politics, but they have not always been concord meetings. In 2019 more than twenty Florentine institutions - gathered in an Organizing Committee coordinated by the Municipality of Florence with the support of MUS.E - decided to tell these two stories through lectures, exhibitions and events open to the general public in a dense and great program interest. On the upper part of the beach there is the "Easy Living" kiosk, part restaurant and part bar, for great food and drinks. With DJs and live music events, it becomes the coolest place to be in summer. Don't miss all the new pop up restaurants and bars with stages for music, all stretched along the opposite side of the river along Lungarno della Zecca Vecchia (just along from our offices!). It's too hot to function some days in the city, and the need to find a pool is relentless, unless you're lucky enough to have a friend with one at home or a hotel with great amenities! EXHIBITIONS

MUMMIES: JOURNEY INTO IMMORTALITY AT THE MUSEO ARCHEOLOGICO OF FLORENCE, Until February 2020

The leitmotif of the exhibition is the Egyptian concept of life after death and the meaning of the objects that were placed in the tomb with the deceased that, according to Egyptian culture, would have been helpful to them once they reached the afterworld. In order to preserve the body, the Egyptians used the embalming method so as to allow them to reincarnate. The exhibition is divided into two sections: the first one displays artefacts concerning the mummification technique while the second deals with the grave goods that accompanied the deceased on their journey to the afterlife. This last part gathers both the objects with strictly funerary functions, like the ushabti or the offering tables, and the everyday items that were placed in the tomb to recreate the home environment of the deceased, for example furnishings or jewellery. MULTISENSORY MUSEUM EXPERIENCE TAKES YOU THROUGH THE SCENTS ANSD

PERFUMES OF FLORENCE IN THE LABORATORY OF LORENZO VILLORESI

Lorenzo Villoresi, the famed Florentine perfume maestro, has opened a 'museum of scent' within his 15th century palazzo which also houses his <u>atelier</u> and an education centre complete with a secret garden. Over three floors, and across 1000 square metres, Museo Villoresi is divided by themes to create a 'study of the senses' in the heart of Florence. Villoresi is renowned for his bespoke perfumes made in his laboratory nestled within his ancestral family home. The Osmorama room is a library of essences and aromatic materials preserved within a monitored air-conditioned system. Here, visitors can explore over 1000 scents via olfactory booths, an interactive map and original films to understand the complexity of perfume-making. In the Perfume Centre, courses, events and seminars unveil the ancient secrets, myths and legends of perfumery, with the library a research centre and showroom complete with a Conversation Salon to host talks. IL PRINCIPE DEI SOGNI: JOSEPH IN THE MEDICI TAPESTRIES BY PONTORMO AND BRONZINO AT PALAZZO VECCHIO, Until August 29

The twenty Medici tapestries showing the stories of Joseph and realized by some of the most important Renaissance artists, are home once again after over 100 years. They were commissioned and devised by Cosimo I de'Medici for the Sala dei Duecento in Palazzo Vecchio: the last time they were all exposed together was on the occasion of the Unification of Italy and then split up in the following years. The series of twenty tapestries telling the "Stories of Joseph", made in Florence in the sixteenth century, 1545-1553, for Cosimo I de' Medici, represents one of the highest examples of Renaissance art and craftsmanship. A SHORT NOVEL ON MEN'S FASHION AT THE PITTI PALACE, Until September 29

The Fondazione Pitti Immagine Discovery presents "A short novel on men's fashion", an exhibit showcasing thirty years of menswear from 1989 to the present as seen through the eyes of Pitti Uomo. Passing through the halls of the Palazzo Pitti Museo della Moda e del Costume one by one, Olivier Saillard will recount the history and evolution of menswear, the intersection of Made in Italy with guest designers, and the fashion talents from the international contemporary scene together with the experiences of leading menswear entrepreneurs. The project is dedicated to the memory of Marco Rivetti, President of Pitti Immagine from 1987 to 1995. More information.

COSIMO I DE' MEDICI'S ARMY OF LANCERS AT THE UFFIZI, Until September 29

The Gallerie degli Uffizi is celebrating the 500th anniversary of the birth of Cosimo I (1519–74), Florence's first Grand Duke, by devoting a 'triptych' of exhibitions to his memory: "A Hundred Lances for the Prince", "Weaving a Biography. The 17th century tapestries in honour of Cosimo I" (Hall of the Niches and White Room in the Pitti Palace from 5 June to 29 September) and "The First Statue for the Boboli Garden. The Peasant Restored" (Hall of the Niches in the Pitti Palace from 5 June to 29 September). The sensational exhibits include what has survived of Cosimo I's own suit of armour, and the splendid armour of Captain Fernberger with the Medici arms embossed on it from the Künsthistorisches Museum in Vienna, in addition to weapons, objects, engravings and portraits.

THE COLOURS OF JUDAISM IN ITALY AT THE UFFIZI, Until October 27

The exhibition explores the history of Italy's Jewish community from a novel and highly colourful angle, the art of textiles. Some 140 exhibits, including tapestries, textiles, decorative fabrics, lace work, clothing, paintings and other items of daily or religious use, present the history of Italy's Jewish community for the first time through one of the lesser-known arts, the art of weaving, which has always played a crucial role in the decoration of houses, palazzi and places of worship in the Jewish world, revealing Judaism's care for its traditions but also its joyful, colourful side that is so rich in symbols. The exhibition also shines the spotlight on the Jewish people's intercultural and international character, thanks primarily to the outstanding variety of the textiles' motifs, where colour often predominates in a dazzling way. DANCE STEPS. ISADORA DUNCAN AT VILLA BARDINI, Until September 22

Isadora Duncan and the figurative arts in Italy between the nineteenth century and the avant-garde. The first Italian exhibition dedicated to the American dancer Isadora Duncan and her relationship with the Italian figurative arts will host about 170 pieces set on two floors of Villa Bardini and a special section dedicated to large sculptures on display at the Stefano Bardini Museum. By turning her back on romantic ballet, which for centuries had been considered to be the only acceptable dance form, Isadora paved the way for dancers to freely develop their own techniques and unique style. Strong-willed and rebellious against every social norm, she was known for moving about in flowy garments and with bare feet in order to make energetic contact with the earth. A central theme in the exhibition is the liberation of the female body, as inspired by models from the archaeological and classical world. Almost 170 paintings, sculptures and other original documents, including neverbefore-seen photographs, retrace her links to Italy and its artists. More information here.

TRAJAN'S COLUMN AT BOBOLI GARDENS, Until October 6

The exhibition allows visitors to track the journey of the huge marble blocks that make up the column from the quarries in Luni at an altitude of 800 metres to the Portus Romae – a voyage of some 200 nautical miles – and from there up the Tiber to the heart of the imperial capital. Designed to celebrate Emperor Trajan's military victories in Dacia, the column is also a monument to the technological and building skills of the Roman world.

DANCE AND THEATRE

FLORENCE DANCE FESTIVAL, 30 YEARS FLORENTINE, Until August 3

We welcome the Florence Dance & Performing Arts Festival, a sensory journey through music, dance, theater and multimedia that manifests in defining the year zero "Classical Novella ... between tradition and modernity". An event in the heart of Florence Summer, where citizenship, but also the

citizens of the world, can experience the Cloister of Santa Maria Novella and its adjoining spaces, at different times of the day, enjoying a full immersion experience in the art of Performance. The Florence Dance Festival, celebrating its 30th season, this year continues in an exemplary way to keep the art of dance in the foreground, making it more accessible and close to the public.

APRITI CINEMA RETURNS TO THE UFFIZI COURTYARD FOR A SUMMER SEASON, Until August 8
