BEST HOLIDAY: THE SUMMERTIME FERRAGOSTO NATIONAL HOLIDAY

Known as the day when absolutely everything is closed, Ferragosto is the key date during the Italian summer holidays. The 15th of August is the Feast of the Assumption, and marked the last day of the summer harvest and the start of a well-earned rest, traditionally in the form of a two-week holiday. Now, Italians take their holidays anytime during July to August, but the Ferragosto holiday holds strong and you can expect almost every Italian to have the day off. Do as they do, and treat yourself to a visit to the seaside, a picnic, or a party outdoors!

BEST TRADITION: THE FEAST OF SAN LORENZO, August 10

San Lorenzo is the co-patron of Florence and every year on 10th August the San Lorenzo district becomes the place of the popular festival par excellence. The Basilica of San Lorenzo, which is also the first consecrated church in the city center, will be the center of all the celebrations. The community comes together in the evening for the traditional distribution of watermelon and lasagna at around 9pm in Piazza San Lorenzo, as well as a concert of classical music in the churchyard. The festivities begin with the Historic Procession of the Florentine Republic that starts at 10am from Piazzetta di Parte Guelfa and arrives at the Basilica in Piazza San Lorenzo, where a holy mass is celebrated.

BEST P&F RENTAL: A PIECE OF PARADISE WITH LOTS OF AVAILABLE AMENITIES

In Italian "Bellosguardo" means beautiful view, certainly a very appropriate name for this neighbourhood. Bellosguardo is a hamlet situated on one of the many hills that surround the city of Florence. It is on the south side of the river and is approx 1 km. or 5 minutes by car and a 15 minute stroll down a path through olive groves leads to Porta Romana, which is an excellent shopping area. Also from Porta Romana there are numerous buses into the historic centre. The location is ideal for accessing the surrounding Tuscan countryside and highways. More information and photos.

The Giardino dell'ArteCultura is one of the most popular summer spaces in Florence and offers every day a rich program of events for all tastes and all ages. This well-equipped space, inside the Garden of Horticulture in Florence, offers every evening various art and entertainment initiatives for adults and, for children, in the park not far from Piazza della Libertà. FREE YOGA CLASSES AT LA CASCINE PARK

This group was born with the intention of sharing a common passion, Yoga, with as many people as possible. A rotating team of yoga instructors from studios all over Florence and Tuscany come to present classes free to the public every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, in the months of June, July, August and September. Classes start at 7.15 pm and end at 9.00 pm, on the grass surrounding the Fountain of Piazzale del Re. Bring a mat or a beach towel and the desire to feel good together!

ESTATE FIORENTINA 2024, THE SUMMER LONG FESTIVAL OF EVENTS AND PERFORMANCES THROUGHOUT FLORENCE, May until September

For the Florentine Summer 2024, 10 major festivals return that form the central focus of this summer explosion of arts and culture! The events span from music, cultural debates, art exhibitions, and itinerant tours to discover Florence, all the way through to literary festivals and live talk shows. We

are set for a summer of creativity and entertainment! The featured festivals are: Apriti Cinema in the Uffizi Square (that includes the film festivals: Festival dei Popoli, Lo Schermo dell'arte, Nice, Middle East), Secret Florence (made up of Fabbrica Europa, Lo Schermo dell'Arte, Musicus Concentus, Tempo Reale, and Danza Virgilio Sieni), Controradio, La Citta dei Lettori, Sagrati in Musica sotto le stelle, Florence Dance Festival, Festival su Désert, Firenze Jazz Festival, Cirk Fantastik!, Lattexplus, and many many other special events. THE SAN NICCOLO TOWER IS OPEN FOR VISITS

On the Festa di San Giovanni in June, the San Niccolò Tower is also opened for the season until the end of September. The medieval tower dates back to 1324 and once formed a part of the old walls around the city. It is the only one of the city towers to retain its original height of 60m (the others were lowered during the siege of 1529 to make them less vulnerable to cannonball fire). This year you can make the climb (around 200 steps) between 5pm and 8pm each day, with visits beginning every 30 minutes. For Bookings write to info@muse.comune.fi.it

BOAT RIDES ON THE MAGNIFICENT ARNO RIVER

An hour's journey in which you will be welcomed by the river and sheltered from the hustle and bustle of the city, while the city of Florence flows by the sides of the boat. The profession of the Renaioli dates back to the beginning of the 20th century. Most of the boats were destroyed during the flood that struck Florence in 1966. In 1995, the Associazione dei Renaioli decided to restore them as they were part of the city's historical heritage. After retrieving the crafts from the riverbed, the members of the Association personally restored them following the traditional technique known as cafalatura. Today the Renaioli boats have been restored to their ancient splendor and are ready to carry you along the waters of the Arno river. IL FIORINO SULL'ARNO, HABANA500, AND MORE OFFER DANCING AND DRINKS ALL ALONG THE LUNGARNO

Florence has its own beaches along the Arno River. Naturally, bathing is strictly forbidden, but for those of you who don't like to go to the swimming pool or can't get to the seashore, this is a fun alternative. Head to "the beach" in San Niccolò where you can find umbrellas, sun loungers and

other wooden gazebos. On the upper part of the beach there is the kiosk, part restaurant and part bar, for great food and drinks. With DJs and live music events, it's a known summer hotspot. OR go straight to the opposite side of the river banks, which erupts with the newest and freshest riverside offerings, including the much beloved Habana500 bar where salsa dancing erupts all summer alongside a volleyball net for spontaneous summer games. Don't miss all the new pop up restaurants and bars with stages for music, all stretched along the opposite side of the river along Lungarno della Zecca Vecchia. DOMENICOALMUSEO: STATE MUSEUMS FREE FOR EVERYONE, AND CIVIC MUSEUMS FREE FOR RESIDENTS ON THE FIRST SUNDAY OF EVERY MONTH

On the first Sunday of every month, Florence opens up all of its state and civic museums free for residents of the city, or people born here. SWIMMING IN FLORENCE: POOLS, POOLS, WHERE ARE THE POOLS?

It's too hot to function some days in the city, and the need to find a pool is relentless, unless you're lucky enough to have a friend with one at home or a hotel with great amenities! If you're on the search for a quick dip, here are your best options. One small note: most pools now require a swimming cap for use.

Le Pavoniere

The famous swimming pool of La Cascine park, with a restaurant, bar, open air swimming pools, and an outdoor stage for a nightclub set up during the summer nights. Open Every Day from 10.00 until 18.30. Via della Catena 2, La Cascine park, Website

Rari Nantes Florentia

Known by Florentines as the place to go for spa indulgence, Asmana has indoor and outdoor pools, beauty and massage treatments, whirlpools, salt pools, saunas and steam rooms. EXHIBITIONS

DO NOT ABANDON ME: LOUISE BOURGEOIS AT MUSEO NOVECENTO, Until Sept

Two exceptional exhibitions – the first one at Museo Novecento Do Not Abandon Me and the other at Museo degli Innocenti Cell XVIII (Portrait). The project brings the works of Louise Bourgeois (Paris, 1911 – New York, 2010) to Florence for the first time, building a significant relationship of osmosis between her creations and the exhibition context. Conceived in close dialogue with the architecture of the former Leopoldine building, a complex with a strong social vocation run for centuries by all-female communities, the exhibition will give the opportunity to experience almost one hundred works by the artist. These will include many gouaches made during the last five years of Bourgeois's life, that explore the cycles of life through an iconography of sexuality, procreation, birth, motherhood, feeding, dependency, the couple, the family unit, and flowers. RETURNS: FROM MODIGLIANI TO MORANDI AT MUSEO NOVECENTO, Until September

(From The Florentine Magazine) Museo Novecento celebrates ten years since its inauguration in 2014 with a major exhibition titled Returns: From Modigliani to Morandi dedicated to the history of one of its most prized ensembles, the Alberto Della Ragione Collection. Donated to the City of Florence following the devastating flood in 1966, the works are now reunited with the invaluable masterpiece by the Livornese artist, Amedeo Modigliani. The idea conceived by the director of the museum, Sergio Risaliti, sees the rooms of the former Leopoldine on the second floor of the museum transformed for the occasion, with the exhibition curated by Eva Francioli, Chiara Toti and Sergio Risaliti on show until September 15. THE CATTEDRALE DELL'IMMAGINE PRESENTS INSIDE VAN GOGH

In the heart of Florence, the deconsecrated church of Santo Stefano al Ponte was reborn with the name "the Cathedral of the Image", transforming itself into the first permanent Italian center for Immersive Art Experiences. Now showing is *Inside Van Gogh*, the new immersive multimedia show, created by Crossmedia and directed by Stefano Fake. A 35-minute digital narrative developed through 360° multiprojection of high-definition images and the Dolby HD audio diffusion of a captivating soundtrack. Enjoy the complex human and artistic story of Vincent van Gogh, one of the most famous and beloved artists of all time. The multimedia experience is enriched by an educational introductory section with infographics and monitors, Oculus stations for experiencing the 3D virtual reality journey inside some famous paintings, and the immersive 'hall of mirrors,' an enveloping kaleidoscope of images located within the immersive hall. DANCE, THEATRE, AND MUSIC

FIRENZE SUONA FESTIVAL 2024

Firenze Suona Estate, a totally free music and literature festival spread throughout the municipal area of Florence! Enjoy concerts by young emerging Italian bands, multimedia shows with musicians and actors, performances by established artists, presentations of books by and with important Tuscan authors, and mini local festivals. The events, all free, take place in the historic center but also on the outskirts and can be enjoyed by everyone, residents and tourists, adults and children. See the program here.

ESTATE FIESOLANA, Until September

Fiesole's Roman amphitheater is a step or two above your average spot for catching a Saturday night music gig or theatre show. Once again, the venue bridges the ancient past with artists of the present, hosting a series of summer shows in a range of genres. The festival has reached its 77th edition, scheduled from 17 June to 13 September 2024 with a program that includes both Italian and International events, from prose to dance, from jazz to classical, all on stage at the Roman Theater of Fiesole. As tradition, the day dedicated to the Music Festival (21 June) will host one of the most important cultural events that celebrates the summer solstice in more than 120 countries around the world. The evening is organized by the Fiesole Music School, entry is free but by reservation. A program full of artists including Florence Jazz Orchestra, Carmen Consoli, Cory Henry, Lyric Dance Company, Rufus Wainwright and much more. SAGRATI IN MUSICA SOTTO LE STELLE, Until September 1

Enjoy the the concerts of "Sagrati in Musica sotto le stelle", the event organised by the Associazione Toscana Classica and consisting of 23 FREE events ranging in musical genres from classical to jazz, rock and electronic music, but all aimed at educating people to listen to music with an awareness of the importance of listening, in order to ward off the deterioration of the church parvises involved: Santi Michele e Gaetano, Santa Felicita, Sacra Famiglia, Santa Maria del Carmine, the Misericordia Piazza Duomo parvis, Isolotto and Santa Croce. CINEMA (AND NOT ONLY) IN MANIFATTURA TABACCHI FOR SUMMER

Manifattura Tabacchi's summer cinema is back in the Cortile della Ciminiera! A space open to everyone and all languages: half of the films offered are in the original version with Italian subtitles.
