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# BEST EVENT: BEST EVENT FOR SEPTEMBER: THE COUNTDOWN IS ON TO CORRI LA VITA 2019, September 29

Join Suzanne and thousands of others for the 17th Edition of Florence's CORRI LA VITA on September 29th. After achieving a record in fundraising and enrolments last year, this year our favourite charity event returns with all new running paths and a new graphic design in honour of the great "Leonardo". This year, the iconic T-shirts will be in the colour pink.

CORRI LA VITA is an event organised in collaboration with Firenze Marathon and serviced by many volunteers, together we help to fight against breast cancer. Not only should you "save the date" and participate, you may also want to take an active part by volunteering and donating funds.

Suzanne is a founding member of this event and has been very involved from its beginning in 2003. The event is to raise funds and awareness of breast cancer in Italy, and especially to support the patients themselves. All proceeds that have been collected, which is over 5 million 700 thousand euro, have been given to help the patients directly and to assist volunteers in executing their work.

From the 2nd September it will be possible to register for the event and ensure one of the coveted T-shirts signed by Salvatore Ferragamo SpA, the prime supporter of the initiative. The 2019 version of the T-shirt is pink and its packaging is a totally bio-commutable bag, as are the water glasses used during the stops of the runners.

"In the year in which the five hundredth year of Leonardo's death is celebrated," announces Bona Frescobaldi, President of the Association CORRI LA VITA, "we have decided to pay homage to the great artist both with the choice of graphic design and in the identification of the routes."

The design will be one of the most famous works of Andrea del Verrocchio, Leonardo's master: the Putto with dolphin, a bronze statue preserved in Palazzo Vecchio that was exhibited at Palazzo Strozzi for the exhibition "Verrocchio, the Master of Leonardo".

The new routes, still being defined, will still follow the passage from Monte Oliveto, whose church once housed Leonardo's "Annunciation" until it was placed in the Uffizi rooms.

The goal of the 2019 fundraiser is to promoted and increase help to all those people in outlaying areas. The association LILT (Italian League for the Fight against Cancer, Section of Florence) supports the care of breast cancer patients after being diagnosed within the Vasta Fiorentina Area (Florence, Prato, Empoli, Pistoia).

In addition to this, support for the three historic projects will be guaranteed: Ce.Ri.On. Oncological Rehabilitation Center of Villa delle Rose in collaboration with LILT, FILE Italian Foundation for palliative care and SenoNetwork Italia, a portal that brings together nationally the Italian Breast Cancer Units.

For those who want to support the CORRI LA VITA project but will not be able to participate in person, the official T-shirt can be delivered with free postage to any home throughout Italy thanks to an agreement with BRT international courier and BoxOffice: a minimum donation of 10 euro is all that is required, which can be made directly on the website <u>www.corrilavita.it</u> The hashtag of this initiative is #corrilavitainitalia.

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This year, the three largest groups will honoured such as: companies, sports clubs, gyms, associations, university students, schools and others. In short, the more we are united, the more possibilities there are. CORRI LA VITA is a recreational and not a competitive event. It is open to everyone. There will be no chip timing, nor any form of classifications, consequently and there will be no prize giving. Please note it is important that each participant follows the rules and codes of a public road.

Street food will fill the length of Piazza Vittorio Veneto: for the entire duration of the event numerous stations will be active along the tree-lined avenue that surrounds the square. All companies will donate 20% of their collections to CORRI LA VITA.

Participants will be able to choose between two new diversified routes of varying degrees of difficulty - one of 11 km and a second of 5.5 km (punctuated by a series of cultural events), which will wind through unusual scenarios and breathtaking views designed for maximum enjoyment of the unique beauty of Florence.

As is tradition, you can also visit a number of exhibitions and museums for free in the afternoon simply by wearing the shirt of CORRI LA VITA 2019 with your registration certificate. A fantastic way of uniting culture, sport and solidarity that has always characterized the initiative.

CORRI LA VITA wants to actively involve the whole city of Florence, which has always reciprocated enthusiastically to the event. Shop windows are invited to compete with each other for the most creative and original showcase using the official T-shirt for CORRI LA VITA 2019 (regulation on <u>www.corrilavita.it</u>).

Fundraising points have been confirmed at all the Unicoop Firenze (12/29 September) and Conad del Tirreno (26/29 September) locations in Tuscany, to which must be added "The 100 shops of Via Gioberti".

### **BEST TRADITION: LA RIFICOLONA, September 7**

Some say the best party in town can be found in Piazza Santissima Annunziata after 9pm on September 7! On the night of September 7, the even of the Madonna's birthday on the 8th,

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Florentines and "pilgrims" (mostly children) carry paper lanterns on sticks as they make their way from Piazza Santa Croce to Piazza Santissima Annunziata, home of the Basilica di Santissima Annunziata which is dedicated to Mary. There is a competition for the most original lantern, and workshops are run by Florence's five districts to teach children how to make their own lantern. Speeches are made in the square, followed by an enormous street party. Then, on September 8th, don't miss the annual Rificolona sull'Arno, when there are lantern-lit boat rides with the Canottieri for children and families along the river Arno. ## BEST FESTIVAL: THE FESTIVAL OF SANTA MARIA DEL FIORE WITH FREE ACCESS TO THE DUOMO TERRACE, September 8

September 8 is the Anniversary of the first stone being set for the building of Santa Maria del Fiore, the cathedral of Florence. Every year the terrace above the rose window is opened free to visitors. The laying of the first stone of the new *ecclesia maior* dates back to the Marian Nativity of 1296. The free opening of the terraces of the Duomo allows Florentines and visitors to enjoy an extraordinary panoramic view over the city of Florence. It is open from 10am until 4.30pm, and access is completely free! Also enjoy a free visit to the workshop of the Opera del Duomo in Via dello Studio 23/r, where the master masons work on the restoration of the marble works for the monumental complex of the cathedral, bell tower, and baptistry. The Baptistery of St. John will also be open for free to all residents of Florence and the province.

# SECOND BEST TRADITION FOR SEPTEMBER: CARRO MATTO, THE CRAZY CART FESTIVAL IN FLORENCE

#### Last Saturday of September

*(Text from: visitflorence.com)* Every year, experience the arrival of the Carro Matto in to town from the nearby wine producing area of Chianti Rufina. Literally translated as "crazy cart", the Carro Matto is pulled by a pair of white oxen and accompanied by a parade in historical costume, drums, flag throwers and even a cannon! Early in the day, you will find the Carro sitting near Piazza Duomo but the main events start around 3:30pm. The cart leaves from Palagio di Parte Guelfa, then returns to the Piazza del Duomo where it gets a blessing. continues to Via Calzaiuoli, makes a stop in front of the Church of San Carlo dei Lombardi, and finally ends in Piazza della Signoria (by around 5pm). Then enjoy exhibitions by the Corteo Storico della Repubblica Fiorentina and the flag throwers Bandierai degli Uffizi. So what is this event with the crazy cart? Today, it celebrates the centuries-old Tuscany tradition of wine-making but it also reconstructs how wine arrived into town. <u>Read more here</u>.

#### BEST MUSIC: FLORENCE JAZZ FESTIVAL 2019, September 11-15

Now in its third edition, the Firenze Jazz Fringe Festival abandons the fringe model and becomes the Florence Jazz Festival, thanks to the contribution of new partners, new locations, and new artistic coordination directed by Enrico Romero. A flagship event with an important partnership: from the Edinburgh Jazz Festival to the historic "Settembre in Piazza della Passera". Clubs, clubs and cocktail bars are transformed into temporary jazz clubs, attracting dozens of local and international musicians from the area. Four intense days of great music, to the rediscovery of places, squares and special

Summer is the time that the San Niccolo Tower opens up for visitors. The medieval tower dates back to 1324 and once formed a part of the old walls around the city. It is the only one of the city towers to retain its original height of 60m (the others were lowered during the siege of 1529 to make them less vulnerable to cannonball fire). This year you can make the climb (around 200 steps) between 5pm and 8pm each day, with visits beginning every 30 minutes.

#### 500 YEARS OF THE MEDICI, ANNIVERSARY FESTIVAL, Until September

The Medici: an ambitious family, grown up between alliances and internal and external struggles for the control of a city state. This year we celebrate two Medici who became princes: Cosimo and Caterina, who were born in the same year: 1519. They were both architects of their own lives thanks to an indomitable spirit forged by raw and violent experiences. Two parallel lives that intersect several times thanks to the strange paths of history and politics, but they have not always been concord meetings. In 2019 more than twenty Florentine institutions - gathered in an Organizing Committee coordinated by the Municipality of Florence with the support of MUS.E - decided to tell these two stories through lectures, exhibitions and events open to the general public in a dense and great program interest. Don't miss all the new pop up restaurants and bars with stages for music, all stretched along the opposite side of the river along Lungarno della Zecca Vecchia (just along from our offices!). ## **#DOMENICOALMUSEO : STATE MUSEUMS FREE FOR EVERYONE, AND CIVIC MUSEUMS FREE FOR RESIDENTS ON THE FIRST SUNDAY OF EVERY MONTH**

On the first Sunday of every month, Florence opens up all of its state and civic museums free for residents of the city, or people born here. Here's a list of the state museums free to all: Uffizi,

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Accademia, Bargello, Medici Chapels, Pitti Palace (all museums), San Marco, Palazzo Davanzati, Medici Villas. ### **EXHIBITIONS**

#### TONY CRAGG AT BOBOLI GARDENS, Until October 27

Bright steel geysers stand out against the sky of Florence, bronze stalagmites of prehistoric appearance and gigantic resin flowers sprout out of the gravel and between the hedges, colossal and candid stems, hilly eruptions and elliptical shapes, colossal interweaving of imaginary fossil forests, metal flows that shake, twist and fold, caught in the last soft phase before solidify: Tony Cragg's monumental sculptures offer an unexpected dialogue, between associations and dissonances, with the orderly nature of the Boboli Gardens and the panorama of the city, between their layered, fragile and organized historical fabric and the primordial force of the sculptural material. ## MUMMIES: JOURNEY INTO IMMORTALITY AT THE MUSEO ARCHEOLOGICO OF FLORENCE, Until February 2020

The leitmotif of the exhibition is the Egyptian concept of life after death and the meaning of the objects that were placed in the tomb with the deceased that, according to Egyptian culture, would have been helpful to them once they reached the afterworld. In order to preserve the body, the Egyptians used the embalming method so as to allow them to reincarnate. The exhibition is divided into two sections: the first one displays artefacts concerning the mummification technique while the second deals with the grave goods that accompanied the deceased on their journey to the afterlife. This last part gathers both the objects with strictly funerary functions, like the ushabti or the offering tables, and the everyday items that were placed in the tomb to recreate the home environment of the deceased, for example furnishings or jewellery. #### MULTISENSORY MUSEUM EXPERIENCE TAKES YOU THROUGH THE SCENTS ANSD PERFUMES OF FLORENCE IN THE LABORATORY OF LORENZO VILLORESI

(From: LonelyPlanet.com) Lorenzo Villoresi, the famed Florentine perfume maestro, has opened a 'museum of scent' within his 15th century palazzo which also houses his atelier and an education centre complete with a secret garden. Over three floors, and across 1000 square metres, Museo Villoresi is divided by themes to create a 'study of the senses' in the heart of Florence. Villoresi is renowned for his bespoke perfumes made in his laboratory nestled within his ancestral family home. The Osmorama room is a library of essences and aromatic materials preserved within a monitored air-conditioned system. Here, visitors can explore over 1000 scents via olfactory booths, an interactive map and original films to understand the complexity of perfume-making. In the Perfume Centre, courses, events and seminars unveil the ancient secrets, myths and legends of perfumery, with the library a research centre and showroom complete with a Conversation Salon to host talks. 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#### A SHORT NOVEL ON MEN'S FASHION AT THE PITTI PALACE, Until September 29

The Fondazione Pitti Immagine Discovery presents "A short novel on men's fashion", an exhibit showcasing thirty years of menswear from 1989 to the present as seen through the eyes of Pitti Uomo. Passing through the halls of the Palazzo Pitti Museo della Moda e del Costume one by one, Olivier Saillard will recount the history and evolution of menswear, the intersection of Made in Italy with guest designers, and the fashion talents from the international contemporary scene together with the experiences of leading menswear entrepreneurs. The project is dedicated to the memory of Marco Rivetti, President of Pitti Immagine from 1987 to 1995. More information.

#### COSIMO I DE' MEDICI'S ARMY OF LANCERS AT THE UFFIZI, Until September 29

The Gallerie degli Uffizi is celebrating the 500th anniversary of the birth of Cosimo I (1519–74), Florence's first Grand Duke, by devoting a 'triptych' of exhibitions to his memory: "A Hundred Lances for the Prince", <u>"Weaving a Biography. The 17th century tapestries in honour of Cosimo I"</u> (Hall of the Niches and White Room in the Pitti Palace from 5 June to 29 September) and <u>"The First Statue for the Boboli Garden. The Peasant Restored"</u> (Hall of the Niches in the Pitti Palace from 5 June to 29 September). The sensational exhibits include what has survived of Cosimo I's own suit of armour, and the splendid armour of Captain Fernberger with the Medici arms embossed on it from the Künsthistorisches Museum in Vienna, in addition to weapons, objects, engravings and portraits. #### THE COLOURS OF JUDAISM IN ITALY AT THE UFFIZI, Until October 27

The exhibition explores the history of Italy's Jewish community from a novel and highly colourful angle, the art of textiles. Some 140 exhibits, including tapestries, textiles, decorative fabrics, lace work, clothing, paintings and other items of daily or religious use, present the history of Italy's Jewish community for the first time through one of the lesser-known arts, the art of weaving, which has always played a crucial role in the decoration of houses, palazzi and places of worship in the Jewish world, revealing Judaism's care for its traditions but also its joyful, colourful side that is so rich in symbols. The exhibition also shines the spotlight on the Jewish people's intercultural and international character, thanks primarily to the outstanding variety of the textiles' motifs, where colour often predominates in a dazzling way. #### DANCE STEPS. ISADORA DUNCAN AT VILLA BARDINI, Until September 22

Isadora Duncan and the figurative arts in Italy between the nineteenth century and the avant-garde. The first Italian exhibition dedicated to the American dancer Isadora Duncan and her relationship with the Italian figurative arts will host about 170 pieces set on two floors of Villa Bardini and a special section dedicated to large sculptures on display at the Stefano Bardini Museum. By turning her back on romantic ballet, which for centuries had been considered to be the only acceptable dance form, Isadora paved the way for dancers to freely develop their own techniques and unique style. Strong-willed and rebellious against every social norm, she was known for moving about in flowy garments and with bare feet in order to make energetic contact with the earth. A central theme in the

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exhibition is the liberation of the female body, as inspired by models from the archaeological and classical world. Almost 170 paintings, sculptures and other original documents, including neverbefore-seen photographs, retrace her links to Italy and its artists. <u>More information here</u>.

#### TRAJAN'S COLUMN AT BOBOLI GARDENS, Until October 6

*(from: visitflorence.com)* The exhibition allows visitors to track the journey of the huge marble blocks that make up the column from the quarries in Luni at an altitude of 800 metres to the Portus Romae – a voyage of some 200 nautical miles – and from there up the Tiber to the heart of the imperial capital. Designed to celebrate Emperor Trajan's military victories in Dacia, the column is also a monument to the technological and building skills of the Roman world.
