BEST EVENT: FLORENCE ART WEEK, September 16-24

As part of the BIAF - Biennale Internazionale di Antiquariato, Florence becomes the protagonist of of both contemporary artistic production and experimentation for its first ever Florence Art Week, with various exhibition projects throughout the city: Museo Novecento, MUS.E, Museo Novecento, Palazzo Medici Riccardi, Uffizi, Palazzo Strozzi, Istituto degli Innocenti and BIAF - Biennale Internazionale di Antiquariato. The programme includes several exhibitions dedicated to the greatest contemporary artists: Henry Moore in Florence, (16 September 2022 - 31 March 2023), Back to Moore. Forte Belvedere 1972 (22 September - 3 October) at the Sala d'Arme of Palazzo Vecchio, the great Olafur Eliasson exhibition at Palazzo Strozzi, with site-specific elements (22 September - 22 January 2023). And again, Tony Cragg (23 September 2022 - 29 January 2023) at the Museo del Novecento, Sammy Baloji at Palazzo Pitti, while Palazzo Medici Riccardi will host, from 24 September , Passione Novecento, Da Paul Klee a Damien Hirst, as well as the exhibition dedicated to the author's comic strips: Bonelli Story, scheduled until 25 September at the Museo degli Innocenti. Finally, the third edition of the Premio Rinascimento + , whose prize-giving ceremony is scheduled for 23 September in Palazzo Vecchio.

BEST P&F RENTAL: A QUIET AND LIGHT APARTMENT IN A WONDERFUL AND INTERESTING LOCATION NEAR THE ACADEMY OF ART

This apartment is located in a wonderfully interesting location, very practical and convenient to all of Florences monuments, markets, artisan work shops and it is very close to the Accademy of Art. Via dei Conciatori in the heart of the Santo Croce area takes it's name from the ancient Medici dye house which has recently been restructured into modern apartments. It is within an easy walk from most of the city's most famous museums and monuments. 10 minutes walk leads to the Sant'Ambrogio



open-air fruit and vegetable market. General shopping is close by. The apartment is situated near several theatres ("Teatro Verdi" and "La Pergola") which host numerous concerts throughout the year, including some performances of the "Maggio Musicale" (the May musical festival) in the spring. This area is becoming very well known for its' famous restaurants: Enoteca Pinchiorri, Cibreo, Alle Murate and Baraonda, all within easy walking distance. More photos and information.

BEST TRADITION: CARRO MATTO, THE CRAZY CART FESTIVAL IN FLORENCE

Last Saturday of September

(Text from: visitflorence.com) Every year, experience the arrival of the *Carro Matto* into town from the nearby wine producing area of Chianti Rufina. Literally translated as "crazy cart", the Carro Matto is pulled by a pair of white oxen and accompanied by a parade in historical costume, drums, flag throwers and even a cannon! Early in the day, you will find the Carro sitting near Piazza Duomo but the main events start around 3:30pm. The cart leaves from Palagio di Parte Guelfa, then returns to the Piazza del Duomo where it gets a blessing. continues to Via Calzaiuoli, makes a stop in front of the Church of San Carlo dei Lombardi, and finally ends in Piazza della Signoria (by around 5pm). Then enjoy exhibitions by the Corteo Storico della Repubblica Fiorentina and the flag throwers Bandierai degli Uffizi. So what is this event with the crazy cart? Today, it celebrates the centuries-old Tuscany tradition of wine-making but it also reconstructs how wine arrived into town. Read more about this tradition here

BEST FESTIVAL: THE FESTIVAL OF SANTA MARIA DEL FIORE WITH FREE ACCESS TO THE DUOMO TERRACE, September 8

September 8 is the Anniversary of the first stone being set for the building of Santa Maria del Fiore, the cathedral of Florence. Every year the terrace above the rose window is opened free to visitors. The laying of the first stone of the new ecclesia maior dates back to the Marian Nativity of 1296. The free opening of the terraces of the Duomo allows Florentines and visitors to enjoy an extraordinary panoramic view over the city of Florence. It is open from 10am until 4.30pm, and access is completely free! Also enjoy a free visit to the workshop of the Opera del Duomo in Via dello Studio 23/r, where the master masons work on the restoration of the marble works for the monumental complex of the cathedral, bell tower, and baptistry. The Baptistery of St. John will also be open for free to all residents of Florence and the province.

BEST TRADITION: LA RIFICOLONA, September 7

Some say the best party in town can be found in Piazza Santissima Annunziata after 9pm on September 7! On the night of September 7, the even of the Madonna's birthday on the 8th, Florentines and "pilgrims" (mostly children) carry paper lanterns on sticks as they make their way from Piazza Santa Croce to Piazza Santissima Annunziata, home of the Basilica di Santissima Annunziata which is dedicated to Mary. There is a competition for the most original lantern, and workshops are run by Florence's five districts to teach children how to make their own lantern. Speeches are made in the square, followed by an enormous street party. Then, on September 8th, don't miss the annual Rificolona sull'Arno, when there are lantern-lit boat rides with the Canottieri for children and families along the river Arno. BEST MUSIC: FLORENCE JAZZ FESTIVAL, September 6-10 and 14-18

In this years edition, the Firenze Jazz Festival hosts a massive 120 artists across 41 events in 10 spectacular locations. An incredible flagship event with an important partnership: from the Edinburgh Jazz Festival to the historic "Settembre in Piazza della Passera". Unexpected local haunts

are transformed into temporary jazz clubs, attracting dozens of local and international musicians from the area. This year, the festival increases to 8 intense days of great music. Rediscover the places, squares and special areas that will form the backdrop for the jazz performances, guiding the general public through the streets and squares of the Oltrarno. BEST DINING OUT: ROTISSERIE 888 LAUNCHES AT MERCATO CENTRALE

International flavours continue to feature on the food scene, with this new opening dedicated to Cantonese roast meats, created by the chef behind Il Gusto Dim Sum. "Sui Mei", the name for Cantonese roasted meats, brings back a nostalgic flavour of Cantonese street food from the 80s. Sui Mei remains one of the most popular types of food for everyday in Guangzhou or HongKong. Hanging in the display you'll find duck, pork belly, rosticciana, and other meats that have spent days in marinade before roasting, then served on beds of noodles or rice. There are also BBQ pork buns, "Cha Siu Bao", soft, fluffy white steamed buns filled with savory char siu or Chinese BBQ pork filling in a sweet and savory char siu sauce; they are absolutely delicious. FLORENCE INTERNATIONAL BIENNALE ANTIQUES FAIR AT PALAZZO CORSINI, September 24 - October 2

The Biennale Internazionale dell'Antiquariato di Firenze reaches its 32nd edition of this historic international antiques exhibition, to be held at Palazzo Corsini. From 24 September to 2 October 2022, Florence will be welcoming the excellence of art and antiques at Palazzo Corsini on the Lungarno. "A museum for sale", as Fabrizio Moretti, in his fourth year as director, defines it. 75 international galleries will be showing no less than 4,500 works of various types, all carefully screened by the authoritative Vetting; the scientific commission of experts from every art sector. The official opening, to be held on **Saturday 24 September at 10.30 a.m.** in the Salone dei Cinquecento in the presence of the Mayor Dario Nardella and the city authorities, will be preceded by three days of previews dedicated to collectors, museum directors and the press, and by a highly anticipated 'black tie' gala dinner. Fireworks will light up the Arno and Palazzo Corsini on 22 September from 11.00 p.m. to the rhythm of music. The BIAF is an integral part of the history of collecting in Italy after the Second World War (1959). Many antiquarians have linked their professional history to the Biennale and just as many collections have been formed as a result of purchases made from the exhibition stands. CHIANTI EXPO AT GREVE IN CHIANTI, Sept 8-11

Wine, wine, and more wine. If you want to celebrate the finished product of the gran vendemmia, then you need to head to Chianti and the wine EXPO. Local producers will have bottles to sample with the purchase of a souvenir glass, you can then stroll through the small town with the stands showcasing their finished products and inhaling the atmosphere of Greve in Chianti and the vendemmia (grape harvest). The Limonaia of Villa Strozzi is one of the most important recreational and cultural centres in the city of florence, with a large indoor area where it is possible to eat or get together for an aperitif while enjoying concerts, screenings and quality shows. THE FESTIVALS OF ESTATE FIORENTINA 2022, TRE PASSI AVANTI

Music, cultural debates, art exhibitions, itinerant tours to discover Florence, literary festivals and talk shows. These are the ingredients of the 15 three-year festivals at the heart of the diffuse calendar of the Florentine Summer 2022. Space is given to all the arts: the international circus of Cirk Fantastik, readers are the protagonists with La città dei lettori that from Florence begins its tour of author presentations and debates around Tuscany, under the motto #leggereciunisce. For the music section, there are performances by world-famous artists of the Florence Jazz Festival, around the Oltrarno; the evocative concerts under the stars of "I Sagrati in musica". More music for the enhancement of traditions and cultures with Festival Au Désert. Lastly, the Copula Mundi gives voice to youth artistic realities active in the territory. Various arts and performances mingle with suggestive views of Florence from above, or in the debates and performances of Genius Loci inside the Monumental Complex of Santa Croce.

TORRE DI SAN NICCOLO: CLIMB THE TOWER

Summer is the time that the San Niccolo Tower opens up for visitors. The medieval tower dates back to 1324 and once formed a part of the old walls around the city? it is the only one of the city towers to retain its original height of 60m (the others were lowered during the siege of 1529 to make them less vulnerable to cannonball fire). 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HONOURING WANDA FERRAGAMO: WOMEN IN BALANCE 1955-1965

The new Museo Ferragamo exhibition showing until 18 April 2023 is dedicated to the figure of Wanda Miletti Ferragamo: Wanda Ferragamo took over the reins of the family business when her husband died, transforming an artisan women's shoe workshop into a fashion house, thus changing her own life and that of her family. Starting from her figure, the exhibition describes the female reality in Italy between the 1950s and the 1960s, in the light of the deep socio-economic changes that characterised the years of the economic boom, with women searching for new life models, searching for a balance between work and family life. TORNABUONI ARTE PRESENTS THEIR NEW CONTEMPORARY ART COLLECTION

Anthology Choice 2022, Modern and Contemporary Art. The Theatre of the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino owes its name to the prestigious Maggio Musicale Festival, the oldest in Italy, a first that it shares in Europe with the festivals of Salzburg and Bayreuth. Founded in Florence in 1933, the festival quickly became a centre of dissemination of the great European musical culture indicating and proposing new and unconventional ideas, in regards to classical repertoire and contemporary compositions. The session is from 19:00 - 21:00 and consists of short warm up poses followed by longer poses as the evening moves along. Tom J. Byrne teaches figure drawing and landscape painting in the Florence Studio Art Academy on Borgo santi Apostoli. Tom is Irish and spends part of his time here in Florence and part in Ireland. Most of his works are in oil and watercolor. He studied art in Paris with Shane Wolf, Jorge Hermle and in Florence with Michael John Angel.

THE ICONIC ODEON CINEMA PRESENTS ORIGINAL LANGUAGE FILMS
