### **BEST TRADITION: ALL SAINTS DAY HOLIDAY, November 1**

Celebrated throughout Italy, Halloween coincides with the major Catholic holiday celebrating the dearly departed and saints. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church who have attained heaven. All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints. The choice of the day may have been intended to co-opt the pagan holiday "Feast of the Lamures," a day which pagans used to placate the restless spirits of the dead, now celebrated as Halloween. Many will make a long weekend out of the holidays this year and you will find lots of Italians out enjoying the city and the Tuscan surrounds. The celebrating of Halloween itself has only recently been adopted here, and is mostly just for children. On November 1st some museums will be closed, and public transport works on a festive schedule. Many stores will be closed. Enjoy the festive mood in the streets or time with family!

## BEST FESTIVAL: XXI JAPANESE FESTIVAL, November 15-17

Take the tram to the "Resistenza" stop, just 20 minutes from Santa Maria Novella station and jump into Japan in all its glory. # BEST MARKET: MERCATO TEDESCO DI NATALE OPENS THE CHRISTMAS SEASON, November 26 - December 22

Hot mulled wine, great beer and a salty, smoky wurstel - all can be found in Piazza Santa Croce

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starting at the end of November, at the Mercato Tedesco di Natale (German Christmas Market). Traditional German food and craft products fill the square, there are also seventeen other countries represented in over fifty stands. A small Christmas village of charming wooden huts, with open areas of tables and chairs where you can sit and enjoy some of the rich German food on offer. Don't forget to try the apple strudel and the hot mulled wine! Open daily from 10am - 10pm.

# BEST EXHIBITION: VISIO. MOVING IMAGES AFTER POST-INTERNET, AT PALAZZO STROZZI November 12 - December 1

An exhibition dedicated to video works by 12 under-35 international artists taking part to VISIO – European Programme on Artists' Moving Images, a project promoted by Lo Schermo dell'arte Film Festival and curated by Leonardo Bigazzi. The exhibition offers an insight into the practice of a generation of artists who, during the years of their education, witnessed the rise of the so-called "Post-Internet condition". This definition has been adopted since the end of the first decade of 2000 in order to describe art that could no longer avoid to confront the growing hyper-connectivity of the internet, both in conceptual and in production and distribution terms. ### BEST DINING OUT: INDULGE AT LA GIOSTRA

La Giostra is known for its quirky backstory and for hosting the likes of Elton John. Run by an Austrian royal family, the space boasts the perfect ambiance for a romantic night out with candle-lit tables and deep red wines in beautiful glass decanters. The plates are carefully crafted and extremely Italian, albeit offering a more gourmet take on traditional trattoria eats. Given the restaurant's popularity, make a reservation in advance.

The Story: "Over twenty five years ago, a Hapsburg Prince and his 3 children joined together to share their family traditions and ancient recipes with the people of Florence. And so the "legend" of La Giostra began... News of a noble family managing with dishes and napkins made headlines, but it did not come as a surprise to everyone. Friends who were accustomed to gathering around the table of the Prince, at his family castle in the Chianti countryside knew very well the magic of his food and had often suggested he open a restaurant." ## 12th EDITION OF LO SCHERMO DELL'ARTE FILM FESTIVAL, November 13-17

Lo schermo dell'arte Film Festival is an international project dedicated to explore, analyse and promote the complex relations between contemporary art and cinema through films, videos, installations, training projects, residencies for international artists and artist films' production and distribution. "This international project has become a European reference point for moving images. Intended to build stronger relationships with international partners on future projects, Lo schermo dell'arte is devoted to the younger generation, and to the vision of artists who describe an increasingly problematic and contradictory present. Thanks to the work carried out by the festival, Florence has become a meeting place for artists, curators, and filmmakers from all over the world,"

## AMERICANS IN FLORENCE, AT PALAZZO ROSSELLI DEL TURCO, November 8-21

The second edition of the contemporary American artists exhibit coincides with the bicentenary of the American diplomatic presence in Florence (#insieme 200). The medieval Palazzo Rosselli del Turco with its impressive Baroque facade and 18th-century frescoed ceilings was previously host to the American embassy from 1865-1871. It was also home to various mid-19th century American painters and sculptors including William Page and Alexander Galt. Nine American artists will exhibit their most recent works at the Stengel Collection, curated by Vito Abba, with works ranging from milk cartons and pop art to coral and coin sculptures. On show 35 works (including paintings and sculptures) by as many artists from 12 countries (Australia, United States, China, Fed. Russia, Greece, Spain, Poland, Israel, Ireland, United Kingdom, Sweden and Italy) who have in common the training course at the academies and art schools of classical tradition present in Florence but also in other countries. An unprecedented cross-section of some excellences in the field of the figurative arts is thus presented to the general public,

an expression of which Pietro Annigoni, whose permanent museum is located at Villa Bardini, is one of the greatest representatives in Italy.

# NATALIA GONCHAROVA, A WOMAN OF THE AVANTE-GARDE WITH GAUGUIN, MATISSE, AND PICASSO, AT PALAZZO STROZZI, Until January 12

Palazzo Strozzi celebrates Natalia Goncharova, a leading female artist of the 20th century, in a major retrospective. The exhibition will explore her unconventional life and career, presenting her rich and multifaceted artistic output with masterpieces from major international collections by celebrated artists including Gauguin, Matisse, Picasso, Balla and Boccioni. Taking visitors on a journey from the Russian countryside to Moscow and Paris, two of the most important cities to Natalia, the exhibition features 130 artworks and gives an account of the unorthodox life of a woman who lived for her art and successfully forged her own unique fusion of tradition and innovation, of East and West, making her own work a unique example of experimentation with artistic genres and styles ranging from New-Primitivism to Rayonisme, painting and graphic art to her work for the theatre. ## NEO RAUCH. PAINTINGS FROM 2008 TO 2019, AT PALAZZO PITTI until January 12

Neo Rauch's dreamlike realism casts its spell on the Pitti Palace. From today until 12 January, in this erstwhile Medicean abode the 19th-century rooms of the Andito degli Angiolini will be hosting the first Italian retrospective devoted to the famous Leipzig-born artist's work. Curated by Max Seidel and Serena Calamai, the exhibition displays 37 paintings of various sizes that Rauch executed between 2008 and 2019. The multi-faceted and enigmatic aesthetics of Rauch mixes, not seldom in the same painting, elements and landscapes borrowed from German figurativism and Romanticism with both the artistic lexis of Socialist realism and the abstract and primeval forms of Surrealism. He therefore succeeds in fusing such aesthetics with the geometrical spaciousness of the architecture and decorations of the Pitti Palace in order to gain a unique visual alchemy. In fact, Rauch has been pursuing such a fusion over time by realizing several paintings among the ones on display in this exhibition, that - as he himself admits - he has conceived specifically for this Medicean abode's premises. # MUMMIES: JOURNEY INTO IMMORTALITY AT THE MUSEO ARCHEOLOGICO OF FLORENCE, Until February 2020

The leitmotif of the exhibition is the Egyptian concept of life after death and the meaning of the objects that were placed in the tomb with the deceased that, according to Egyptian culture, would have been helpful to them once they reached the afterworld. In order to preserve the body, the Egyptians used the embalming method so as to allow them to reincarnate. The exhibition is divided into two sections: the first one displays artefacts concerning the mummification technique while the second deals with the grave goods that accompanied the deceased on their journey to the afterlife. This last part gathers both the objects with strictly funerary functions, like the ushabti or the offering tables, and the everyday items that were placed in the tomb to recreate the home environment of the deceased, for example furnishings or jewellery. # INSIDE MAGRITTE, MULTIMEDIA EXHIBITION AT THE CHIESA DI SANTO STEFANO AL PONTE, Until March 1

An experience between the real and the imaginary, between the evocation of a dream world and the story of the concrete life of one of the greatest painters of the twentieth century, one of the greatest exponents of surrealism. "Inside Magritte" is a multimedia exhibition dedicated to the great surrealist master René Magritte (1898 - 1967), conceived and signed by Crossmedia Group and Hepco who produce the event directed by The Fake Factory. The exhibition will animate the Cathedral of the Image in Santo Stefano al Ponte with a suggestive immaterial, visual and sound architecture, which will reconstruct the pictorial universe of Magritte. # MULTISENSORY MUSEUM EXPERIENCE TAKES YOU THROUGH THE SCENTS ANSD PERFUMES OF FLORENCE IN THE LABORATORY OF LORENZO VILLORESI

(From: LonelyPlanet.com) Lorenzo Villoresi, the famed Florentine perfume maestro, has opened a 'museum of scent' within his 15th century palazzo which also houses his atelier and an education centre complete with a secret garden. Over three floors, and across 1000 square metres, Museo Villoresi is divided by themes to create a 'study of the senses' in the heart of Florence. Villoresi is renowned for his bespoke perfumes made in his laboratory nestled within his ancestral family home. The Osmorama room is a library of essences and aromatic materials preserved within a monitored air-conditioned system. Here, visitors can explore over 1000 scents via olfactory booths, an interactive map and original films to understand the complexity of perfume-making. In the Perfume Centre, courses, events and seminars unveil the ancient secrets, myths and legends of perfumery, with the library a research centre and showroom complete with a Conversation Salon to host talks. #### THEATRE AND MUSIC AT TEATRO DELLA PERGOLA

The Teatro della Pergola is a historic opera house located in the centre of the city on Via della Pergola, from which the theatre takes its name. It was built in 1656 under the patronage of Cardinal Gian Carlo de' Medici to designs by the architect Ferdinando Tacca, son of the sculptor Pietro Tacca.

Swan Lake, today perhaps the most famous ballet in the world, continues to maintain its charm for the lunar atmosphere that accompanies Odette's appearance, for the double role of Odette-Odile, white swan and black swan, and for the eternal struggle between Good and Evil. A flagship for the St. Petersburg Ballet with the fabulous and enchanted music of P.I. Tchaikovsky and choreography by Marius Petipa.

## **OUR PICK FOR THE MONTH: The Three Tenors** (with optional dinner)

Add a taste of Italian lyricism to your stay in Florence: Three tenors perform opera arias and famous traditional Neapolitan songs in the heart of Tuscany's beautiful capital. In the Auditorium Santo Stefano al Ponte Vecchio, the soloists are accompanied by a chamber ensemble of mandolin, cello, and piano. Famous arias from 'La Traviata', 'Rigoletto', and 'Tosca' share the program with Neopolitan favorites like 'O sole mio', 'Funiculì Funiculà', and 'Torna a Surriento'. Before the concert, indulge in Tuscan cuisine between the 18th-century walls of Guelfi and Ghibellini Restaurant at Relais Santa Croce in the heart of Florence. Enjoy your meal among fine furnishings and frescoed ceilings, and take advantage of the opportunity to admire the wooden roof trusses based on a design by Leonardo Da Vinci. Situated in Relais Santa Croce, they were installed in 18th century to support the great chandelier of the Music Hall.
